4	SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the Texas Small
5	Business Protection Act.
6	SECTION 2. Section 62.002, Labor Code, is amended by adding
7	Subdivision (8) to read as follows:

10	SECTION 3. Subtitle D, Title 2, Labor Code, is amended by
11	adding Chapter 83 to read as follows:
12	CHAPTER 83. PROHIBITION AGAINST LOCAL REGULATION OF EMPLOYMENT
13	<u>BENEFITS</u>
14	Sec. 83.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
15	(1) "Employee" means an individual who is employed by
16	an employer for compensation.
17	(2) "Employer" means a person who employs one or more
18	employees.
19	(3) "Employment benefit" means anything of value that
20	an employee receives from an employer in addition to monetary
21	compensation, including:
22	(A) health, disability, retirement,
23	<pre>profit-sharing, and death benefits;</pre>
24	(B) group accidental death and dismemberment

- 2 (C) paid days off from work for holidays, sick
- 3 leave, vacation, and personal necessity.
- 4 Sec. 83.002. PROHIBITION AGAINST MUNICIPALITY OR COUNTY
- 5 REQUIRING EMPLOYMENT BENEFITS. A municipality or county may not
- 6 adopt or enforce an ordinance, order, rule, or regulation that
- 7 requires an employer in the municipality or county to provide
- 8 employment benefits.
- 9 SECTION 4. Chapter 83, Labor Code, as added by this Act,
- 10 applies to an ordinance, order, rule, or regulation adopted before,
- 11 on, or after the effective date of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
