A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the display of the national motto and the founding
- 3 documents of the United States in public schools and the inclusion
- $4\,$ of an elective course on the founding principles of the United
- 5 States in the curriculum for public high school students.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 1.004, Education Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 1.004. DISPLAY OF NATIONAL MOTTO AND FOUNDING
- 10 <u>DOCUMENTS</u>. (a) A public elementary or secondary school [or an
- 11 institution of higher education as defined by Section 61.003 must
- 12 display in a conspicuous place in each building of the school [or
- 13 institution] a durable poster or framed copy of the United States
- 14 national motto, "In God We Trust," and the founding documents of the
- 15 United States if the poster or framed copy meets the requirements of
- 16 Subsection (b) and is:
- 17 (1) donated for display at the school [or
- 18 institution]; or
- 19 (2) purchased from private donations and made
- 20 available to the school [or institution].
- 21 (a-1) In this section, "founding documents of the United
- 22 States" means:
- 23 (1) the United States Declaration of Independence;
- 24 (2) the United States Constitution; and

- 1 (3) Essays 10 and 57 of the Federalist Papers.
- 2 (b) A poster or framed copy [of the national motto]
- 3 described by Subsection (a):
- 4 (1) must contain:
- 5 (A) the national motto, a representation of the
- 6 United States flag centered under the national motto, and a
- 7 representation of the state flag;
- 8 (B) one or more of the founding documents of the
- 9 United States; or
- 10 (C) both the items described by Paragraph (A) and
- one or more items described by Paragraph (B); and
- 12 (2) may not depict any words, images, or other
- 13 information other than the items [representations] listed in
- 14 Subdivision (1).
- 15 (c) A public elementary or secondary school [and an
- 16 institution of higher education] may accept and use private
- 17 donations for the purposes of Subsection (a).
- SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
- 19 amended by adding Section 28.0111 to read as follows:
- Sec. 28.0111. FOUNDING PRINCIPLES ELECTIVE. (a) Each
- 21 school district and open-enrollment charter school that offers a
- 22 high school program shall provide an elective course on the
- 23 founding principles of the United States that meets the
- 24 requirements for a one-half elective credit under Section 28.025.
- 25 (b) The course must focus on the principles underlying the
- 26 United States form of government, the Declaration of Independence,

- 1 the United States Constitution, the Federalist Papers, and the
- 2 writings of the founding fathers of the United States.
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 28.0111, Education Code, as added by
- 4 this Act, applies beginning with the 2024-2025 school year.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- $7\,\,$ provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
