A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to parental rights in public education and to audits of
- 3 school district curricula by the Texas Education Agency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 7.057, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsection (a-2) to read as follows:
- 7 (a-2) A person who is a parent of or person standing in
- 8 parental relation to a child enrolled in a school district and who
- 9 <u>submits an appeal under Subsection (a) may designate the appeal as</u>
- 10 confidential. An appeal designated as confidential under this
- 11 subsection may not be disclosed to the public and is not public
- 12 information under Chapter 552, Government Code.
- SECTION 2. Section 26.009(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 (a) An employee of a school district must obtain the written
- 16 consent of a child's parent before the employee may:
- 17 (1) conduct a psychological examination, test, or
- 18 treatment, unless the examination, test, or treatment is required
- 19 under Section 38.004 or state or federal law regarding requirements
- 20 for special education; [or]
- 21 (2) conduct a social or psychological experiment
- 22 <u>involving the child that seeks to investigate how a person's</u>
- 23 behavior influences the behavior of a group or the internal states
- 24 of members of a group, such as attitude or self-concept; or

- 1 (3) make or authorize the making of a videotape of a
- 2 child or record or authorize the recording of a child's voice.
- 3 SECTION 3. Chapter 26, Education Code, is amended by adding
- 4 Section 26.0092 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 26.0092. CONSENT REQUIRED FOR CERTAIN CONTENT. (a) A
- 6 school district must obtain the written consent of a child's parent
- 7 before the district may provide to the child instruction involving:
- 8 (1) visual material that contains violence,
- 9 profanity, illegal substance use, nudity, or sexual content; or
- 10 (2) written material that contains violence, other
- 11 than violence included as part of a depiction of a historical event,
- 12 <u>or sexual content.</u>
- 13 (b) This section does not apply to material in a required
- 14 textbook. Notwithstanding Section 5.002, for purposes of this
- 15 <u>subsection</u>, "textbook" means a book published primarily for the
- 16 <u>instruction of elementary or secondary school students.</u>
- 17 SECTION 4. Section 26.011, Education Code, is amended by
- 18 adding Subsections (a-1) and (c) to read as follows:
- 19 (a-1) The grievance procedure adopted under Subsection (a)
- 20 must allow a parent to designate a complaint as confidential. A
- 21 complaint designated as confidential may not be disclosed to the
- 22 public and is not public information under Chapter 552, Government
- 23 <u>Code</u>.
- (c) On receipt of a complaint by a parent regarding a
- 25 <u>violation of a right guaranteed by this chapter, the board of</u>
- 26 trustees of a school district shall provide to the parent a physical
- 27 copy of the district's grievance procedure adopted under this

- 1 section and the procedure to appeal a decision of the district's
- 2 board of trustees to the commissioner under Section 7.057.
- 3 SECTION 5. Chapter 26, Education Code, is amended by adding
- 4 Section 26.014 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 26.014. NOTICE TO PARENTS OF VIOLATION. (a) If the
- 6 board of trustees of a school district or the commissioner
- 7 determines that a violation of a right guaranteed by this chapter
- 8 occurred at the district, the district shall provide written notice
- 9 of the determination to the parent of each student enrolled in the
- 10 district not later than the 30th day after the date on which the
- 11 determination is made.
- 12 (b) The notice must describe the actions being taken by the
- 13 district to remedy the violation.
- 14 SECTION 6. Chapter 39, Education Code, is amended by adding
- 15 Subchapter O to read as follows:
- 16 <u>SUBCHAPTER O. CURRICULUM AUDITS</u>
- Sec. 39.501. CURRICULUM AUDITS REQUIRED. (a) Each year,
- 18 the agency shall conduct an audit of the curriculum used in school
- 19 districts to ensure compliance with applicable federal and state
- 20 law.
- 21 (b) The commissioner by rule shall establish the procedures
- 22 for auditing curriculum under Subsection (a) and the schedule by
- 23 which those audits will be conducted at each school district.
- Sec. 39.502. POSTING OF NONCOMPLIANT CURRICULA. Each year,
- 25 the agency shall post on the agency's Internet website a list,
- 26 disaggregated by school district, of curricula that the agency
- 27 determined were not in compliance with applicable federal and state

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- 1 law as a result of the curriculum audit conducted for that year
- 2 under Section 39.501.
- 3 Sec. 39.503. NOTIFICATION TO PARENTS. (a) Each school
- 4 district included on the list of noncompliant curricula posted on
- 5 the agency's Internet website under Section 39.502 shall provide
- 6 written notice of the agency's determination to the parent of or
- 7 person standing in parental relation to each student enrolled in
- 8 the district not later than the 30th day after the date on which the
- 9 list is posted on the agency's Internet website.
- 10 (b) The notice must describe the actions being taken by the
- 11 district to remedy the noncompliance.
- 12 SECTION 7. Section 26.0092, Education Code, as added by
- 13 this Act, applies beginning with the 2023-2024 school year.
- 14 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
