5	SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 256, Health and Safety

9	SECTION 2. Chapter 256, Health and Safety Code, is amended

11	Sec. 256.003. PROHIBITED DISCHARGE OF PATIENTS TO CERTAIN
12	GROUP-CENTERED FACILITIES. (a) Subject to Subsection (b), a
13	hospital or other health facility may discharge or otherwise
14	release a patient to the care of a group home, boarding home
15	facility, or similar group-centered facility only if the person who
16	operates the group-centered facility holds a license or permit
17	issued in accordance with applicable state law.

- 12 SECTION 3. Section 256.003(c), Health and Safety Code, as
- 13 added by this Act, applies only to a cause of action that accrues on
- 14 or after the effective date of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
