- 12 GROUP-CENTERED FACILITIES. (a) Subject to Subsection (b), a
- hospital or other health facility may discharge or otherwise 13
- 14 release a patient to the care of a group home, boarding home
- facility, or similar group-centered facility only if the person who 15
- 16 operates the group-centered facility holds a license or permit
- issued in accordance with applicable state law. 17
- 18 (b) A hospital or other health facility may discharge or
- otherwise release a patient to the care of a group home, boarding 19
- home facility, or similar group-centered facility operated by a 20
- person who does not hold a license or permit issued in accordance 21
- with applicable state law only if: 22
- (1) no group-centered facility is operated in the 23

- 8 (d) A local health authority may not issue an order
- 9 authorizing a hospital or health facility to discharge or release a
- 10 patient to a group-centered facility in a manner that conflicts

- 12 SECTION 3. Section 256.003(c), Health and Safety Code, as
- 13 added by this Act, applies only to a cause of action that accrues on
- 14 or after the effective date of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
