- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 38, Education Code, is 6
- 7 amended by adding Section 38.020 to read as follows:
- Sec. 38.020. PARENTAL NOTIFICATION CONCERNING NURSES. (a) 8
- In this section, "nurse" means a person licensed under Chapter 301, 9
- 10 Occupations Code.

- 11 (b) Except as otherwise provided by Subsection (g), a public
- 12 school, including an open-enrollment charter school, that does not
- have a full-time nurse or the equivalent of a full-time nurse 13
- 14 assigned to be present at the school for more than 30 consecutive
- instructional days during the same school year shall provide 15
- 16 written notice of the absence to the parent of or other person
- standing in parental relation to each student enrolled in the 17
- school. 18
- (c) A school has the equivalent of a full-time nurse under 19
- Subsection (b) if the school has two or more nurses assigned to the 20
- 21 school and all regular student instructional hours at the school
- during the regular school day are covered by the assignment of at 22
- 23 least one nurse.
- (d) The principal of the school shall provide the notice 24

- 1 required by Subsection (b) not later than the 30th instructional
- 2 day after the first day the school does not have a full-time nurse
- 3 or the equivalent of a full-time nurse assigned to be present at the
- 4 school.
- 5 (e) The school shall:
- 6 (1) make a good faith effort to ensure that the notice
- 7 required by this section is provided in a bilingual form to any
- 8 parent or other person standing in parental relation whose primary
- 9 language is not English; and
- 10 (2) retain a copy of any notice provided under this
- 11 section.
- 12 (f) A school may satisfy the notice requirement under
- 13 Subsection (d) by posting the notice on the school's Internet
- 14 website. Notice posted under this subsection must be accessible
- 15 from the home page of the Internet website by use of not more than
- 16 three links.
- 17 (g) This section does not apply to a school district or
- 18 open-enrollment charter school with a student enrollment of less
- 19 than 10,000 students.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 21 school year.
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
