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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of the Texas African American Heritage 3 Commission. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Subtitle D, Title 4, Government Code, is amended by adding Chapter 452 to read as follows: 6 CHAPTER 452. TEXAS AFRICAN AMERICAN HERITAGE COMMISSION 7 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS 8 9 Sec. 452.001. PURPOSE. The purpose of the Texas African American Heritage Commission is to identify, preserve, interpret, 10 and promote sites reflecting this state's African American 11 12 heritage. Sec. 452.002. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "commission" 13 14 means the Texas African American Heritage Commission. Sec. 452.003. SUNSET ACT. The Texas African American 15 16 Heritage Commission is subject to Chapter 325 (Texas Sunset Act). Unless continued in existence as provided by that chapter, the 17 commission is abolished and this chapter expires September 1, 2035. 18 Sec. 452.004. ADMINISTRATIVE ATTACHMENT. (a) 19 The commission is administratively attached to the Texas Historical 20 21 Commission but is independent of direction by the Texas Historical Commission. 22 23 (b) The Texas Historical Commission shall provide 24 administrative support services, including human resources,

9 (1) applications for designating state historical markers at sites for which a claim is made regarding the site's 10 connection to African American heritage; and 11

12 (2) proposed projects submitted to the Texas Historical Commission by a state agency for consultation under 13 14 Section 106, National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (54 U.S.C. 15 Section 306108) in which a claim is made regarding the project site's connection to African American heritage. 16

17 (b) The Texas Historical Commission shall enter into a memorandum of understanding with the commission to coordinate 18 19 consultations under Subsection (a) and any other joint efforts of 20 both commissions. 21

SUBCHAPTER B. COMMISSION

Sec. 452.051. ESTABLISHMENT. The commission is established 22 to preserve, interpret, and promote sites reflecting this state's 23 24 African American heritage.

25 Sec. 452.052. COMMISSION MEMBERSHIP. (a) The commission 26 is composed of nine members as follows:

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(1) seven members appointed by the Texas Legislative

2	(2) one member appointed by the president of Texas			
3	Southern University; and			
4	(3) one member appointed by the president of Prairie			
5	View A&M University.			
6	(b) Commission members must:			
7	(1) have a demonstrated interest in the preservation			
8	of African American heritage; and			
9	(2) be residents of this state.			
10	(c) Appointments to the commission shall be made to ensure			
11	<pre>that:</pre>			
12	(1) each geographic area of this state is represented			
13	on the commission; and			
14	(2) the commission includes:			
15	(A) at least one member with significant			
16	professional experience in the preservation of African American			
17	heritage; and			
18	(B) at least one member with significant			
19	professional experience in African American history, genealogy, or			
20	archeology.			
21	Sec. 452.053. TERMS; VACANCY. (a) Commission members			
22	shall be appointed to staggered six-year terms with the terms of			
23	one-third of the members expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered			
24	year.			
25	(b) Commission members are eligible for reappointment to			
26	another term or part of a term.			
27	(c) A vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the			

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1	original appointment. A member appointed to fill a vacancy on the
2	commission shall serve for the remainder of the term for which the
3	predecessor of the member was appointed.
4	Sec. 452.054. REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES. A commission
5	member serves without pay but is entitled to reimbursement for the
6	travel expenses incurred by the member in attending commission
7	meetings as provided by the General Appropriations Act.
8	Sec. 452.055. PRESIDING OFFICER; OTHER OFFICERS. The
9	commission members shall elect from among the commission's members
10	a presiding officer and other officers considered necessary.
11	Sec. 452.056. REMOVAL. (a) It is a ground for removal from
12	the commission that the commission member:
13	(1) is ineligible for membership under Section
14	<u>452.052(b);</u>
15	(2) cannot because of illness or disability discharge
16	the member's duties for a substantial part of the term for which the
17	member is appointed; or
18	(3) is absent from more than half of the regularly
19	scheduled commission meetings the member is eligible to attend
20	during a calendar year unless the absence is excused by majority
21	vote of the commission.
22	(b) The validity of a commission action is not affected by
23	the fact that it is taken when a ground for removal of a commission
24	member exists.
25	Sec. 452.057. COMMISSION MEETINGS; QUORUM; PUBLIC
26	PARTICIPATION. (a) The commission shall meet at least three times
27	each year at the times and places in this state the commission

S.B. No. 194 1 designates. 2 (b) Five commission members constitute a quorum for 3 transacting commission business. 4 (c) The commission shall develop and implement policies 5 that provide the public with a reasonable opportunity to appear before the commission and speak on any issue under the commission's 6 7 jurisdiction. 8 Sec. 452.058. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR; STAFF. (a) The Texas Historical Commission shall provide one employee to serve as the 9 10 executive director for the commission to transact commission business. 11 12 (b) The Texas Historical Commission may provide additional staff and may support commission functions and activities from 13 money available to the Texas Historical Commission that may be used 14 15 for this purpose. SUBCHAPTER C. DUTIES AND FUNDING 16 17 Sec. 452.101. GENERAL DUTIES. The commission may: (1) promote public awareness of historic buildings, 18 19 sites, and structures reflecting this state's African American heritage through special programs and events, exhibitions, 20 publications, and educational materials; 21 22 (2) support African American heritage education at the elementary, secondary, and college or university levels; 23 24 (3) develop a program to catalog, preserve, assess, and interpret sites reflecting this state's African American 25 heritage; 26 27 (4) build a statewide network of individuals,

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1	organizations, and institutions interested in the preservation of
2	sites reflecting this state's African American heritage;
3	(5) make recommendations to the Texas Historical
4	Commission and county historical commissions regarding the
5	preservation of sites reflecting the state's African American
6	heritage, including recommendations regarding the installation of
7	markers recognizing districts, sites, individuals, events,
8	structures, and objects significant to African American history,
9	archeology, or culture;
10	(6) make recommendations to state agencies and local
11	governmental entities regarding policies and programs to promote
12	the preservation of sites reflecting this state's African American
13	heritage;
14	(7) appoint advisory committees as the commission
15	considers necessary to carry out this chapter;
16	(8) provide technical assistance to local governments
17	and nonprofit organizations to further the study and preservation
18	of African American heritage; and
19	(9) promote collaboration among local African
20	American heritage organizations in this state and provide support
21	and services to those organizations.
22	Sec. 452.102. ADVISORY STATUS. (a) In implementing its
23	duties under this chapter, the commission functions only in an
24	advisory capacity. Commission membership does not constitute a
25	public office.
26	(b) Chapter 2110 does not apply to the commission.
27	Sec. 452.103. FUNDING. (a) The commission may accept

1 gifts, grants, or donations or raise money from any available public or private source for the commission to use in performing the 2 3 commission's duties under this chapter. 4 (b) The legislature may specifically appropriate money to 5 the Texas Historical Commission to provide staff and to otherwise support commission functions and activities, or appropriate money 6 7 directly to the commission. 8 (c) The commission may participate in the establishment and operation of an affiliated nonprofit organization dedicated to 9 10 raising money for or providing services or other benefits to the 11 commission. Sec. 452.104. TEXAS AFRICAN AMERICAN HERITAGE COMMISSION 12 ACCOUNT. The Texas African American Heritage Commission account is 13 14 created as an account in the general revenue fund. The Texas 15 Historical Commission shall administer the account. Distributions from the account may be used only for furthering the purposes of 16 17 this chapter and commission duties under this chapter. The account is composed of: 18 19 (1) amounts the legislature appropriates to the 20 account; and 21 (2) gifts, grants, and other donations the commission receives for the account. 22 SECTION 2. (a) Not later than January 1, 2024, the Texas 23 24 Legislative Black Caucus, the president of Texas Southern University, and the president of Prairie View A&M University shall 25 26 appoint members to the Texas African American Heritage Commission as provided by Chapter 452, Government Code, as added by this Act. 27

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In appointing the initial commission members, the 1 (b) officials described by Subsection (a) of this section shall 2 3 appoint: 4 (1) three members to serve terms expiring February 1, 5 2025; 6 (2) three members to serve terms expiring February 1, 7 2027; and 8 (3) three members to serve terms expiring February 1, 2029. 9 SECTION 3. The Texas Historical Commission is required to 10 implement a provision of this Act only if the legislature 11 appropriates money specifically for that purpose. 12 If the legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that 13 purpose, the commission may, but is not required to, implement a 14 15 provision of this Act using other appropriations available for that purpose. 16

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
