2 (7) one representative of a medical advocacy3 organization in this state;

4 (8) one county official who serves in an elected
5 office of a county with a population of less than 35,000;

6 (8-a) one county clerk of a county with a population of
7 less than 60,000;

8 (8-b) one sheriff of a county with a population of less9 than 60,000;

10 (9) one municipal official who serves in an elected 11 office of a municipality with a population of less than 20,000 12 located in a county with a population of less than 60,000;

(10) one representative of an institution of higher education that has its main campus in a county with a population of less than 60,000;

16 (11) one representative of a school district with a 17 territory that includes only counties with a population of less 18 than 60,000;

19 (12) one representative from a library association;
20 (13) one hospital administrator employed by a licensed

21 hospital located in a county with a population of less than 60,000;

territory that includes all or part of a county with a population of
