A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the service credit used in calculating longevity pay 3 for certain judges and prosecutors.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 25.0005(a), Government Code, is amended 6 to read as follows:

7 (a) A statutory county court judge, other than a statutory county court judge who engages in the private practice of law, shall 8 9 be paid a total annual salary set by the commissioners court at an amount that is not less than \$1,000 less than the sum of the annual 10 salary as set by the General Appropriations Act in accordance with 11 12 Section 659.012 paid to a district judge with comparable years of service as the statutory county court judge and any state or county 13 contributions and supplements paid to a district judge in the 14 county, other than contributions received as compensation under 15 16 Section 74.051. A statutory county court judge's total annual 17 salary includes any state or county contributions and supplements paid to the judge. For purposes of this subsection, the years of 18 service of a statutory county court judge include any years of 19 20 service as:

21 <u>(1)</u> an appellate court, district court, multicounty 22 statutory county court, or statutory probate court justice or 23 judge<u>; or</u>

(2) a district attorney, criminal district attorney,

1 or county attorney.

2 SECTION 2. Section 25.0023(a), Government Code, is amended 3 to read as follows:

(a) The commissioners court shall set the total annual 4 5 salary of each judge of a statutory probate court at an amount that is at least equal to the sum of the annual salary as set by the 6 General Appropriations Act in accordance with Section 659.012 paid 7 8 to a district judge with comparable years of service as the statutory probate court judge and any state or county contributions 9 and supplements paid to a district judge in the county, other than 10 contributions received as compensation under Section 74.051. A 11 12 statutory probate court judge's total annual salary includes any 13 state or county contributions and supplements paid to the judge, 14 other than contributions paid under Section 25.0022(e). For 15 purposes of this subsection, the years of service of a statutory probate court judge include any years of service as: 16

17 <u>(1)</u> an appellate court, district court, multicounty 18 statutory county court, or statutory county court justice or judge<u>;</u> 19 <u>or</u>

20 (2) a district attorney, criminal district attorney, 21 or county attorney.

22 SECTION 3. Section 25.2607(d), Government Code, is amended 23 to read as follows:

(d) Notwithstanding Section 25.0015, the state shall
annually compensate the administrative county of a multicounty
statutory county court for the salary of the judge of the
multicounty statutory county court in an amount equal to 100

No. 277 1 percent of the state [base] salary paid to a district judge with comparable years of service as the multicounty statutory county 2 3 court judge, as set by the General Appropriations Act in accordance with Section 659.012 [659.012(a)]. For purposes of this subsection, 4 5 the years of service of a multicounty statutory county court judge 6 include any years of service as: 7 (1) an appellate court, district court, statutory 8 county court, or statutory probate court justice or judge; or (2) a district attorney, criminal district attorney, 9 10 or county attorney. SECTION 4. Section 41.013, Government Code, is amended to 11 12 read as follows: Sec. 41.013. COMPENSATION OF CERTAIN 13 PROSECUTORS. (a) 14 Except as otherwise provided by law, a district attorney or 15 criminal district attorney is entitled to receive from the state annual compensation in an amount equal to at least 80 percent of the 16 17 state annual salary as set by the General Appropriations Act in accordance with Section 659.012 paid to a district judge with 18 19 comparable years of service as the district attorney or criminal district attorney. 20 21 (b) For purposes of this section, the years of service of a district attorney or criminal district attorney include any years 22 23 of service as: 24 (1) a district attorney, criminal district attorney, 25 or county attorney; or 26 (2) an appellate court justice, district judge, judge of a statutory county court, judge of a multicounty statutory 27

1	county court, or judge or justice of a statutory probate court.
2	SECTION 5. Section 46.003, Government Code, is amended by
3	adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
4	(a-1) For purposes of this section, the years of service of
5	the state prosecuting attorney or a state prosecutor include any
6	years of service as:
7	(1) a county attorney; or
8	(2) an appellate court justice, district judge, judge
9	of a statutory county court, judge of a multicounty statutory
10	county court, or judge or justice of a statutory probate court.
11	SECTION 6. Section 659.012(b), Government Code, is amended
12	to read as follows:
13	(b) A judge or justice for whom the amount of a state base
14	salary is prescribed by Subsection (a) is entitled to an annual
15	salary from the state in the amount equal to:
16	(1) 110 percent of the state base salary paid in
17	accordance with Subsection (a) for the judge's or justice's
18	position, beginning with the pay period that begins after the judge
19	or justice accrues four years of:
20	(A) contributing service credit in the Judicial
21	Retirement System of Texas Plan One or the Judicial Retirement
22	System of Texas Plan Two;
23	(B) service as a judge of a statutory county
24	court, multicounty statutory county court, or statutory probate
25	court or as a district attorney, criminal district attorney, or
26	<u>county attorney;</u> or
27	(C) combined contributing service credit and

1 service as provided by Paragraphs (A) and (B); and

2 (2) 120 percent of the state base salary paid in 3 accordance with Subsection (a) for the judge's or justice's 4 position, beginning with the pay period that begins after the judge 5 or justice accrues eight years of:

6 (A) contributing service credit in the Judicial
7 Retirement System of Texas Plan One or the Judicial Retirement
8 System of Texas Plan Two;

9 (B) service as a judge of a statutory county 10 court, multicounty statutory county court, or statutory probate 11 court <u>or as a district attorney, criminal district attorney, or</u> 12 <u>county attorney</u>; or

13 (C) combined contributing service credit and14 service as provided by Paragraphs (A) and (B).

SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
