A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the sale, design, and manufacture of clear aligners.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 431, Health and Safety
5	Code, is amended by adding Section 431.024 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 431.024. CLEAR ALIGNERS. (a) In this section:
7	(1) "Clear aligner" means a medical device, excluding
8	a retainer used to keep teeth in a fixed position, that is:
9	(A) used in orthodontic treatment to move a
10	patient's teeth or jaw or correct a misalignment; and
11	(B) manufactured to address the specific
12	orthodontic needs of an individual patient.
13	(2) "Dentist" means a person licensed to practice
14	dentistry in this state under Subtitle D, Title 3, Occupations
15	Code.
16	(b) A person may not sell a clear aligner to a patient in
17	this state or provide a service related to the design or manufacture
18	of a clear aligner unless the person:
19	(1) is a dentist who has provided the services
20	prescribed by Subsection (c) to the patient; or
21	(2) receives written or electronic confirmation from a
22	dentist who has provided the services prescribed by Subsection (c)
23	to the patient.
24	(c) A person may not sell a clear aligner or provide a

service related to the design or manufacture of a clear aligner to a
<pre>patient in this state who has not received:</pre>
(1) an in-person intraoral dental examination and an
examination of the patient's head and neck;
(2) a review of recently performed x-rays, panoramic
x-rays, computed tomography, bone imaging scans, or other
appropriate diagnostic imaging sufficient to allow the dentist to
detect patient conditions that preclude or contraindicate the
provision of safe orthodontic treatment, including:
(A) untreated caries;
(B) gingivitis and periodontal disease;
(C) issues with the roots of teeth in the
periodontium, including short roots;
(D) the presence of an osseointegrated dental
implant or other fixed dental appliance;
(E) fractured, cracked, or split teeth or roots;
<u>or</u>
(F) any other oral pathology or condition that
<pre>precludes orthodontic treatment;</pre>
(3) a prescription for a clear aligner issued by:
(A) the dentist who provided the examination
described by Subdivision (1) and reviewed the appropriate
diagnostic imaging described by Subdivision (2); or
(B) the dentist who:
(i) will conduct and monitor the patient's
orthodontic treatment; and
(ii) has either:

1	(a) received a referral from the
2	patient's dentist described by Paragraph (A); or
3	(b) requested, received, and
4	maintained clearance for orthodontic treatment from the patient's
5	dentist described by Paragraph (A);
6	(4) subject to Subsection (d), counsel by a dentist
7	described by Subdivision (3) regarding available orthodontic
8	treatment options and the risks associated with those treatments;
9	<u>and</u>
10	(5) a review of the patient's medical and dental health
11	histories.
12	(d) The required counsel under Subsection (c)(4) is valid
13	only if the patient acknowledges and verifies in writing, with the
14	patient's signature, that the patient received the counsel. The
15	dentist providing the required counsel shall attach and maintain
16	the patient's written acknowledgment of counsel in the patient's
17	<u>file.</u>
18	(e) A person who sells a clear aligner to a patient or
19	provides a service related to the design or manufacture of a clear
20	aligner shall maintain any documents received under Subsection (c)
21	for not less than seven years after the date of sale or provision of
22	services.
23	(f) A dentist may not require a patient to agree to use a
24	particular type of clear aligner as a condition of performing the
25	examination or review described by Subsections (c)(1) and (2).
26	(g) A dentist described by Subsection (c)(3)(A) shall

provide any records collected under Subsections (c)(1) and (2) to

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- 1 another dentist in accordance with Section 258.109, Occupations
- 2 <u>Code</u>, if:
- 3 (1) disclosure of a dental record is authorized under
- 4 Subchapter C, Chapter 258, Occupations Code; and
- 5 (2) the other dentist requests the records.
- SECTION 2. Section 431.024, Health and Safety Code, as 6 7 added by this Act, applies only to services related to the design or manufacture of a clear aligner that are provided or a clear aligner 8 9 sold on or after the effective date of this Act. Services related to the design or manufacture of a clear aligner that are provided or 10 a clear aligner sold before the effective date of this Act is 11 governed by the law in effect immediately before the effective date 12 of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose. 13
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
