## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to continuing education requirements for physicians 2 3 regarding the identification and assistance of trafficked persons. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 156.060, Occupations Code, is amended to 5 6 read as follows: Sec. 156.060. CONTINUING 7 EDUCATION REGARDING THEIDENTIFICATION AND ASSISTANCE OF TRAFFICKED PERSONS [IN HUMAN 8 TRAFFICKING PREVENTION]. This section applies only to a 9 (a) physician who designates a direct patient care practice on an 10 application for renewal of a registration permit. 11 12 (b) A physician licensed under this subtitle who submits an 13 application for renewal of a registration permit [and who designates a direct patient care practice] must complete at least 14 one hour of continuing medical education under this section 15 regarding the identification and assistance of trafficked persons: 16 17 (1) in the first renewal period following the issuance of the physician's initial registration permit under this chapter; 18 and 19 (2) if the board approves more than one course under 20 Subsection (d), at least once in every third renewal period 21 22 following the renewal period described by Subdivision (1)[, as part of the hours of continuing medical education required 23 compliance with Section 156.051(a)(2), a human 24 <del>\_trafficking</del>

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prevention course approved by the executive commissioner of the
 Health and Human Services Commission under Section 116.002].

3 (c) [(b)] The hours [board shall designate the human 4 trafficking prevention course] required by Subsection (b):

5 (1) must be designated by the board [<del>(a)</del>] as [<del>a</del>] 6 medical ethics or professional responsibility <u>education; and</u>

7 (2) may be counted toward the hours of [course for 8 purposes of complying with] continuing medical education required 9 by Section 156.051(a)(2).

10 (d) [(c)] The board shall adopt rules to implement this section, including rules to establish the content of and approval 11 requirements for continuing medical education relating to the 12 13 identification and assistance of trafficked persons. In adopting rules, the board shall seek input from affected parties and review 14 relevant courses, including courses that have been approved in 15 16 other states. Rules adopted under this section must provide for the identification and approval of accredited continuing medical 17 18 education courses that represent an appropriate spectrum of relevant information relating to the identification and assistance 19 20 of trafficked persons.

(e) A physician may satisfy the requirement of Subsection (b)(1) by completing at least one hour of a training course approved by the executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission under Section 116.002. This subsection expires September 1, 2025.

26 (f) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), a physician who on
27 September 1, 2023, holds a license to practice medicine under this

 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 156.060, Occupations Code, as amended by

6 this Act, applies only to an application for renewal of a 7 registration permit to practice medicine submitted on or after the 8 effective date of this Act. A renewal application submitted before 9 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on 10 the date the application was submitted, and the former law is 11 continued in effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
