A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to the use of unmanned aircraft by the Texas military
- 3 forces.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 423.002(a), Government Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) It is lawful to capture an image using an unmanned
- 8 aircraft in this state:
- 9 (1) for the purpose of professional or scholarly
- 10 research and development or for another academic purpose by a
- 11 person acting on behalf of an institution of higher education or a
- 12 private or independent institution of higher education, as those
- 13 terms are defined by Section 61.003, Education Code, including a
- 14 person who:
- 15 (A) is a professor, employee, or student of the
- 16 institution; or
- 17 (B) is under contract with or otherwise acting
- 18 under the direction or on behalf of the institution;
- 19 (2) in airspace designated as a test site or range
- 20 authorized by the Federal Aviation Administration for the purpose
- 21 of integrating unmanned aircraft systems into the national
- 22 airspace;
- 23 (3) as part of an operation, exercise, or mission of
- 24 any branch of the United States military;

- 1 (4) if the image is captured by a satellite for the
- 2 purposes of mapping;
- 3 (5) if the image is captured by or for an electric or
- 4 natural gas utility or a telecommunications provider:
- 5 (A) for operations and maintenance of utility or
- 6 telecommunications facilities for the purpose of maintaining
- 7 utility or telecommunications system reliability and integrity;
- 8 (B) for inspecting utility or telecommunications
- 9 facilities to determine repair, maintenance, or replacement needs
- 10 during and after construction of such facilities;
- 11 (C) for assessing vegetation growth for the
- 12 purpose of maintaining clearances on utility or telecommunications
- 13 easements; and
- 14 (D) for utility or telecommunications facility
- 15 routing and siting for the purpose of providing utility or
- 16 telecommunications service;
- 17 (6) with the consent of the individual who owns or
- 18 lawfully occupies the real property captured in the image;
- 19 (7) pursuant to a valid search or arrest warrant;
- 20 (8) if the image is captured by a law enforcement
- 21 authority or a person who is under contract with or otherwise acting
- 22 under the direction or on behalf of a law enforcement authority:
- 23 (A) in immediate pursuit of a person law
- 24 enforcement officers have reasonable suspicion or probable cause to
- 25 suspect has committed an offense, not including misdemeanors or
- 26 offenses punishable by a fine only;
- 27 (B) for the purpose of documenting a crime scene

- 1 where an offense, not including misdemeanors or offenses punishable
- 2 by a fine only, has been committed;
- 3 (C) for the purpose of investigating the scene
- 4 of:
- 5 (i) a human fatality;
- 6 (ii) a motor vehicle accident causing death
- 7 or serious bodily injury to a person; or
- 8 (iii) any motor vehicle accident on a state
- 9 highway or federal interstate or highway;
- 10 (D) in connection with the search for a missing
- 11 person;
- 12 (E) for the purpose of conducting a high-risk
- 13 tactical operation that poses a threat to human life;
- 14 (F) of private property that is generally open to
- 15 the public where the property owner consents to law enforcement
- 16 public safety responsibilities; or
- 17 (G) of real property or a person on real property
- 18 that is within 25 miles of the United States border for the sole
- 19 purpose of ensuring border security;
- 20 (9) if the image is captured by state or local law
- 21 enforcement authorities, or a person who is under contract with or
- 22 otherwise acting under the direction or on behalf of state
- 23 authorities, for the purpose of:
- 24 (A) surveying the scene of a catastrophe or other
- 25 damage to determine whether a state of emergency should be
- 26 declared;
- 27 (B) preserving public safety, protecting

- 1 property, or surveying damage or contamination during a lawfully
- 2 declared state of emergency; or
- 3 (C) conducting routine air quality sampling and
- 4 monitoring, as provided by state or local law;
- 5 (10) at the scene of a spill, or a suspected spill, of
- 6 hazardous materials;
- 7 (11) for the purpose of fire suppression;
- 8 (12) for the purpose of rescuing a person whose life or
- 9 well-being is in imminent danger;
- 10 (13) if the image is captured by a Texas licensed real
- 11 estate broker in connection with the marketing, sale, or financing
- 12 of real property, provided that no individual is identifiable in
- 13 the image;
- 14 (14) from a height no more than eight feet above ground
- 15 level in a public place, if the image was captured without using any
- 16 electronic, mechanical, or other means to amplify the image beyond
- 17 normal human perception;
- 18 (15) of public real property or a person on that
- 19 property;
- 20 (16) if the image is captured by the owner or operator
- 21 of an oil, gas, water, or other pipeline for the purpose of
- 22 inspecting, maintaining, or repairing pipelines or other related
- 23 facilities, and is captured without the intent to conduct
- 24 surveillance on an individual or real property located in this
- 25 state;
- 26 (17) in connection with oil pipeline safety and rig
- 27 protection;

- 1 (18) in connection with port authority surveillance 2 and security;
- 3 (19) if the image is captured by a registered
- 4 professional land surveyor in connection with the practice of
- 5 professional surveying, as those terms are defined by Section
- 6 1071.002, Occupations Code, provided that no individual is
- 7 identifiable in the image;
- 8 (20) if the image is captured by a professional
- 9 engineer licensed under Subchapter G, Chapter 1001, Occupations
- 10 Code, in connection with the practice of engineering, as defined by
- 11 Section 1001.003, Occupations Code, provided that no individual is
- 12 identifiable in the image; [or]
- 13 (21) if:
- 14 (A) the image is captured by an employee of an
- 15 insurance company or of an affiliate of the company in connection
- 16 with the underwriting of an insurance policy, or the rating or
- 17 adjusting of an insurance claim, regarding real property or a
- 18 structure on real property; and
- 19 (B) the operator of the unmanned aircraft is
- 20 authorized by the Federal Aviation Administration to conduct
- 21 operations within the airspace from which the image is captured; or
- 22 (22) if the image is captured by the Texas military
- 23 forces, as defined by Section 437.001, pursuant to an active duty
- 24 operation, exercise, or mission and:
- 25 (A) the image is of real property or a person on
- 26 real property that is within 25 miles of the United States border
- 27 and the image was captured for the sole purpose of ensuring border

2	(B) the image is captured during a lawfully
3	declared state of emergency and in connection with:
4	(i) the search for a missing person; or
5	(ii) a professional engineering operation.
6	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
7	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
8	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
9	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
10	Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
