3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Section 51.355, Occupations Code, is amended by
5	adding Subsections (a-1) and (a-2) to read as follows:
6	(a-1) Subsection (a) does not apply to a person whose
7	license was revoked under Section 455.251(b)(1).
8	(a-2) This subsection and Subsection (a-1) expire September
9	<u>1, 2025.</u>
10	SECTION 2. Section 455.152, Occupations Code, is amended to
11	read as follows:
12	Sec. 455.152. INELIGIBILITY FOR LICENSE. A person is not
13	eligible for a license as a massage establishment, massage school,
14	massage therapist, or massage therapy instructor if the person is
15	an individual and has been convicted of, entered a plea of nolo
16	contendere or guilty to, or received deferred adjudication for $\underline{\cdot}$
17	(1) an offense under Chapter 20A, Penal Code, or
18	Section 43.03, 43.031, 43.04, 43.041, or 43.05 [Subchapter A,
19	Chapter $43$ ], Penal Code $\underline{;}$ [ $ au$ ] or
20	(2) an offense under federal law or the laws of another
21	state containing elements that are substantially similar to the
22	elements of an offense described by Subdivision (1) [another sexual

23 offense].

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SECTION 3. The heading to Section 455.251, Occupations

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- 1 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 455.251. GROUNDS FOR LICENSE DENIAL, [OR] DISCIPLINARY
- 3 ACTION, OR ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY.
- 4 SECTION 4. Sections 455.251(a) and (b), Occupations Code,
- 5 are amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) The commission or executive director may refuse to issue
- 7 a license to a person, [and shall] suspend, revoke, or refuse to
- 8 renew the license of a person, or impose an administrative penalty
- 9 under Subchapter F, Chapter 51, on [shall reprimand] a person
- 10 licensed under this chapter if the person:
- 11 (1) obtains or attempts to obtain a license by fraud,
- 12 misrepresentation, or concealment of material facts;
- 13 (2) sells, barters, or offers to sell or barter a
- 14 license;
- 15 (3) violates a rule adopted by the commission under
- 16 this chapter;
- 17 (4) engages in unprofessional conduct as defined by
- 18 commission rule that endangers or is likely to endanger the health,
- 19 welfare, or safety of the public;
- 20 (5) violates an order or ordinance adopted by a
- 21 political subdivision under Chapter 243, Local Government Code; or
- 22 (6) violates this chapter.
- 23 (b) The commission or executive director shall revoke the
- 24 license of a person licensed as a massage therapist or massage
- 25 therapy instructor if:
- 26 (1) the person is convicted of, enters a plea of nolo
- 27 contendere or guilty to, or receives deferred adjudication for:

- 1 (A) an offense under Chapter 20A, Penal Code, or
- 2 Section 43.03, 43.031, 43.04, 43.041, or 43.05, Penal Code
- 3 [involving prostitution or another sexual offense]; or
- 4 (B) an offense under federal law or the laws of
- 5 another state containing elements that are substantially similar to
- 6 the elements of an offense described by Paragraph (A); or
- 7 (2) the commission or executive director determines
- 8 the person has practiced or administered massage therapy at or for a
- 9 sexually oriented business.
- 10 SECTION 5. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 11 of this Act, the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall
- 12 adopt rules necessary to implement Sections 455.152 and 455.251,
- 13 Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.
- SECTION 6. Section 51.355(a-1), Occupations Code, as added
- 15 by this Act, applies only with respect to a license revoked under
- 16 Section 455.251(b)(1), Occupations Code, as that section existed
- 17 immediately before the effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
