population of more than 1.2 million; and 1 2 (C) contains two highways that are part of the national system of interstate and defense highways; 3 4 (12) a municipality with a population of more than 3,000 and less than 10,000 that: 5 6 (A) contains a highway that is part of the 7 national system of interstate and defense highways; and 8 (B) is located in a county with a population between 150,000 and 155,000; 9 10 a municipality with a population of less than (13)75,000 that is located in three counties, at least one of which has 11 a population greater than 3.3 million; 12 a municipality with a population between 14,000 13 (14)and 17,000 that: 14 15 (A) contains three or more numbered United States 16 highways; and 17 (B) is located in a county that is adjacent to a 18 county with a population of more than 200,000; [or] a municipality with a population of less than 19 (15) 50,000 that is located in: 20 a county that generated \$20 million or more 21 (A) 22 in tax revenue collected under Chapters 201 and 202, Tax Code, from oil and gas production during the preceding state fiscal year; or 23 a county that is adjacent to two or more 24 (B) 25 counties described by Paragraph (A); or (16) a municipality that is located: 26 27 (A) within 20 miles of an international airport;
