1	AN ACT
2	relating to Firefighters Enrolled in Fire Science Courses
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Sec 54.353, Education Code, is amended to read as
5	follows: (a) The governing board of an institution of higher
6	education shall exempt from the payment of tuition and laboratory
7	fees any student enrolled in one or more courses offered as part of
8	a fire science curriculum who:
9	(1) is employed as a firefighter by a political subdivision
10	of this state; or
11	(2) <u>a member in good standing in a volunteer firefighter</u>
12	department, registered with Texas Forest Service and providing 911
13	service to a designated area: is currently, and has been for at
14	least one year, an active member of an organized volunteer fire
15	department participating in the Texas Emergency Services
16	Retirement System or a retirement system established under the
17	Texas Local Fire Fighters Retirement Act (Article 6243e, Vernon's
18	Texas Civil Statutes) and who holds:
19	(i) attends at least 20 hours of annual training;
20	(ii) attends or provides support services for at
21	least 25 percent of the departments emergencies in a calendar
22	year; and
23	(iii) and who holds:
24	(A) an Accredited Advanced level of certification, or

- an equivalent successor certification, under the State Firemen's and Fire Marshals' Association of Texas volunteer certification program; or
- 4 (B) Phase V (Firefighter II) certification, or an equivalent successor certification, under the Texas Commission on Fire Protection's voluntary certification program under Section 419.071, Government Code.
- 8 (b) An exemption provided under this section does not apply
 9 to deposits that may be required in the nature of security for the
 10 return or proper care of property loaned for the use of students.
- 11 (c) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), a student who for a
 12 semester or term at an institution of higher education receives an
 13 exemption under this section may continue to receive the exemption
 14 for a subsequent semester or term at any institution only if the
 15 student makes satisfactory academic progress toward a degree or
 16 certificate at that institution as determined by the institution
 17 for purposes of financial aid.
- (d) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), the exemption provided under this section does not apply to any amount of additional tuition the institution elects to charge a resident undergraduate student under Section 54.014(a) or (f).
- (e) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), the exemption provided under this section does not apply to any amount of tuition the institution charges a graduate student in excess of the amount of tuition charged to similarly situated graduate students because the student has a number of semester credit hours of doctoral work in excess of the applicable number provided by Section 61.059(1)(1) or

- 9 the exemption under this section.
