A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to renaming the Texas Natural Resources Information System as the Texas Geographic Information Office and the duties of 3 certain officers of that entity. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 16.017(b), Water Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 (b) The executive administrator shall operate as part of the 8 Texas Geographic Information Office [Natural Resources Information 9 System] a strategic mapping program to acquire, store, and 10 11 distribute digital, geospatial information. 12 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 16.021, Water Code, is 13 amended to read as follows: Sec. 16.021. TEXAS <u>GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION OFFICE</u> [NATURAL 14 RESOURCES INFORMATION SYSTEM]. 15 SECTION 3. Sections 16.021(a), (b), (c), and (e), Water 16 Code, are amended to read as follows: 17 (a) The executive administrator shall establish the Texas 18 Geographic Information Office [Natural Resources Information 19 System (TNRIS)] to serve Texas agencies and citizens as a 20 21 centralized clearinghouse and referral center for: 22 (1) natural resource data; 23 (2) census data; 24 (3) data related to emergency management; and

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(4) other socioeconomic data.

2 (b) The executive administrator may, on behalf of the Texas Geographic Information Office [TNRIS], enter into partnerships 3 with private entities to provide additional funding for improved 4 5 access to Texas Geographic Information Office [TNRIS] information. The board shall adopt administrative rules to describe the process 6 of establishing partnerships, define the types of partnerships that 7 8 may be formed, establish the fee collection process, and define the nondiscriminatory methods used to determine which private entities 9 10 may enter into partnerships. Any process developed by the board must comply with all applicable laws regarding ethics, purchasing, 11 12 and contracts.

13 (c) The executive administrator shall designate the <u>deputy</u> 14 <u>executive administrator</u> [<u>director</u>] of the Texas <u>Geographic</u> 15 <u>Information Office</u> [<u>Natural Resources Information System</u>] to serve 16 as the state geographic information officer. The state geographic 17 information officer shall:

18 (1) coordinate the acquisition and use of 19 high-priority imagery and data sets;

20 (2) establish, support, and disseminate authoritative
21 statewide geographic data sets;

(3) support geographic data needs of emergencymanagement responders during emergencies;

24 (4) monitor trends in geographic information25 technology; and

26 (5) support public access to state geographic data and27 resources.

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(e) The executive administrator shall:

(1) further develop the Texas <u>Geographic Information</u>
<u>Office</u> [Natural Resources Information System] by promoting and
providing for effective acquisition, archiving, documentation,
indexing, and dissemination of natural resource and related digital
and nondigital data and information;

7 (2) obtain information in response to disagreements 8 regarding names and name spellings for natural and cultural 9 features in the state and provide this information to the Board on 10 Geographic Names of the United States Department of the Interior;

(3) make recommendations to the Board on Geographic Names of the United States Department of the Interior for naming any natural or cultural feature subject to the limitations provided by Subsection (f);

15 (4) make recommendations to the Department of 16 Information Resources to adopt and promote standards that 17 facilitate sharing of digital natural resource data and related socioeconomic data among federal, state, and local governments and 18 other interested parties; 19

20 (5) acquire and disseminate natural resource and 21 related socioeconomic data describing the Texas-Mexico border 22 region; and

(6) coordinate, conduct, and facilitate the development, maintenance, and use of mutually compatible statewide digital base maps depicting natural resources and man-made features.

27 SECTION 4. Section 16.023(b), Water Code, is amended to

1 read as follows:

(b) The account may be appropriated only to the board to:
(1) develop, administer, and implement the strategic
4 mapping program;

5 (2) provide grants to political subdivisions for 6 projects related to the development, use, and dissemination of 7 digital, geospatial information; and

8 (3) administer, implement, and operate other programs 9 of the Texas <u>Geographic Information Office</u> [Natural Resources 10 Information System], including:

(A) the operation of a Texas-Mexico border region information center for the purpose of implementing Section 13 16.021(e)(5);

(B) the acquisition, storage, and distributionof historical maps, photographs, and paper map products;

16 (C) the maintenance and enhancement of 17 information technology; and

(D) the production, storage, and distribution of
other digital base maps, as determined by the executive
administrator.

21 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
