## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to additional periods of possession of or access to a child

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 157.168, Family Code, is amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 Sec. 157.168. ADDITIONAL PERIODS OF POSSESSION OR ACCESS.
- 8 (a) Unless a party shows good cause why the order should not be
- 9 rendered, a [A] court shall [may] order additional periods of
- 10 possession of or access to a child to compensate for the denial of
- 11 court-ordered possession or access, including when the denial
- 12 resulted from an investigation by the Department of Family and
- 13 Protective Services that did not result in a finding of abuse or
- 14 neglect.
- 15 (a-1) The additional periods of possession or access:
- 16 (1) must be of the same type and duration of the
- 17 possession or access that was denied;
- 18 (2) may include weekend, holiday, and summer
- 19 possession or access; and
- 20 (3) must occur on or before the second anniversary of
- 21 the date the court finds that court-ordered possession or access
- 22 has been denied.
- 23 (b) The person denied possession or access is entitled to
- 24 decide the time of the additional possession or access, subject to

- 1 the provisions of Subsection (a-1)(1) [(a)(1)].
- 2 SECTION 2. The enactment of this Act does not constitute a
- 3 material and substantial change of circumstances sufficient to
- 4 warrant modification of a court order or portion of a decree that
- 5 provides for the possession of or access to a child rendered before
- 6 the effective date of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 8 to a suit affecting the parent-child relationship pending before a
- 9 trial court on or filed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 10 A suit affecting the parent-child relationship in which a final
- 11 order is rendered before the effective date of this Act is governed
- 12 by the law in effect on the date the order was rendered, and the
- 13 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
