4	SECTION 1. Section 437.309, Government Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	Sec. 437.309. TEXAS STATE GUARD <u>RETIRED STATUS</u> [HONORARY
7	RESERVE]. (a) The governor, [or] adjutant general <u>, or commander of</u>
8	the Texas State Guard, under the governor's authority and
9	direction, shall place on retired status [may transfer to the Texas
10	State Guard Honorary Reserve] an officer or enlisted service member
11	of the Texas State Guard who, on separation from the Texas State
12	Guard:
13	(1) is physically disabled <u>as a result of service</u> [+
14	[(2) is at least 60 years of age]; or
15	(2) [(3)] has served the federal or state military
16	satisfactorily for at least 20 years of combined service, with at
17	least five years of service in the Texas State Guard.
18	(b) The governor may advance the service member one grade or
19	rank at the time of <u>placement on retired status</u> [the transfer into
20	the honorary reserve]. For a service member who is not a general
21	officer, the adjutant general may advance the service member one
22	grade or rank at the time of <u>placement on retired status</u> [the
23	transfer into the honorary reserve].
24	(c) The commander of the Texas State Guard shall issue an

1	identification card to an officer or service member who is placed on
2	retired status.
3	SECTION 2. Section 437.308(a), Government Code, is amended
4	to read as follows:
5	(a) The commander of the Texas State Guard shall maintain
6	and preserve the individual and unit records of the Texas State
7	Guard and the officers or service members placed on retired status
8	[the Texas State Guard Honorary Reserve].

9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
