## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to allowing school districts to employ chaplains to
3	perform the duties of school counselors.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 33.002, Education Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
7	(d) Notwithstanding Subsections (b) and (c) or any other
8	law, a school district may employ a chaplain instead of a school
9	counselor to perform the duties required of a school counselor
10	under this title. A chaplain employed under this subsection is not
11	required to be certified by the State Board for Educator
12	Certification.
13	SECTION 2. Section 48.115(b), Education Code, is amended to
14	read as follows:
15	(b) Funds allocated under this section must be used to
16	improve school safety and security, including costs associated
17	with:
18	(1) securing school facilities, including:
19	(A) improvements to school infrastructure;
20	(B) the use or installation of physical barriers;
21	and
22	(C) the purchase and maintenance of:
23	(i) security cameras or other security
24	equipment; and

- 1 (ii) technology, including communications
- 2 systems or devices, that facilitates communication and information
- 3 sharing between students, school personnel, and first responders in
- 4 an emergency;
- 5 (2) providing security for the district, including:
- 6 (A) employing school district peace officers,
- 7 private security officers, and school marshals; and
- 8 (B) collaborating with local law enforcement
- 9 agencies, such as entering into a memorandum of understanding for
- 10 the assignment of school resource officers to schools in the
- 11 district;
- 12 (3) school safety and security training and planning,
- 13 including:
- 14 (A) active shooter and emergency response
- 15 training;
- 16 (B) prevention and treatment programs relating
- 17 to addressing adverse childhood experiences; and
- 18 (C) the prevention, identification, and
- 19 management of emergencies and threats, using evidence-based,
- 20 effective prevention practices and including:
- 21 (i) providing licensed counselors, social
- 22 workers, chaplains, and individuals trained in restorative
- 23 discipline and restorative justice practices;
- 24 (ii) providing mental health personnel and
- 25 support, including chaplains;
- 26 (iii) providing behavioral health
- 27 services, including hiring chaplains;

- 1 (iv) establishing threat reporting
- 2 systems; and
- 3 (v) developing and implementing programs
- 4 focused on restorative justice practices, culturally relevant
- 5 instruction, and providing mental health support, including the
- 6 utilization of chaplains; and
- 7 (4) providing programs related to suicide prevention,
- 8 intervention, and postvention, including the utilization of
- 9 chaplains.
- 10 SECTION 3. Each board of trustees of a school district and
- 11 each governing body of an open-enrollment charter school shall take
- 12 a record vote not later than six months after the effective date of
- 13 this Act on whether to adopt a policy authorizing every campus of
- 14 the district or school to hire a chaplain under Sections 33.002 and
- 15 48.115, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 17 school year.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
