A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the issuance of state parklands passports to and a
- 3 waiver of certain state park fees for veterans, active duty armed
- 4 forces members, and certain family members of a person who died
- 5 while serving in the United States armed forces.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 13.018, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
- 8 amended by amending Subsections (a), (c), and (e) and adding
- 9 Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 10 (a) The following people may apply to the department for a
- 11 state parklands passport:
- 12 (1) a resident of this state who is 65 years old or
- 13 over who has resided in the state for six consecutive months
- 14 preceding the date of application for a parklands passport[, a
- 15 member of the United States armed forces on active duty who is 65
- 16 years old or over, or any other individual in a category that the
- 17 commission by rule designates as a resident of this state who is 65
- 18 years old or over;
- 19 (2) a veteran of the armed services of the United
- 20 States [who, as a result of military service, has a
- 21 service-connected disability, as defined by the Veterans'
- 22 Administration, consisting of the loss of the use of a lower
- 23 extremity or of a 60 percent disability rating and who is receiving
- 24 compensation from the United States because of the disability];

- 1 [and]
- 2 (3) a member of the United States armed services on
- 3 <u>active duty;</u>
- 4 (4) a surviving spouse, parent, child, or sibling of a
- 5 person who died while serving in the United States armed forces; and
- 6 <u>(5)</u> an individual who has a physical or mental
- 7 impairment that substantially limits one or more of the major life
- 8 activities of the individual.
- 9 (c) The holder of a state parklands passport issued on or
- 10 before August 31, 1995, a person whose birth date is before
- 11 September 1, 1930, or a person [veteran] described by Subsection
- 12 (a)(2), (3), or (4) is entitled to enter any state park without
- 13 payment of an entrance or admission fee. When a fee is charged by
- 14 the department for entrance of a vehicle into a state park, the
- 15 vehicle of the holder of a state parklands passport is exempt from
- 16 the fee when the holder is present.
- 17 (e) A state parklands passport issued to a person described
- 18 by Subsection (a)(3) is valid for one year from the date of issuance
- 19 and may be renewed in the manner prescribed by commission rule.
- 20 <u>(f)</u> The commission by rule shall establish eligibility
- 21 requirements and privileges available to the holder of a state
- 22 parklands passport described by Subsection (a)(5) [(a)(3)].
- 23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
