- 2 relating to inservice training on identifying abuse, neglect, and
- 3 illegal, unprofessional, and unethical conduct in certain health

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 161.133(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) The executive commissioner by rule shall require each
- 9 inpatient mental health facility, treatment facility, or hospital
- 10 that provides comprehensive medical rehabilitation services to
- 11 annually provide as a condition of continued licensure a minimum of
- 12 eight hours of <u>initial</u> inservice training <u>for new employees and</u>
- 13 four hours of continuing inservice training for continuing
- 14 employees that is designed to assist employees and health care
- 15 professionals associated with the facility in identifying patient
- 16 abuse or neglect and illegal, unprofessional, or unethical conduct
- 17 by or in the facility.
- SECTION 2. Section 161.133(a), Health and Safety Code, as
- 19 amended by this Act, applies to the minimum number of inservice
- 20 training hours provided as a condition of licensure by health care
- 21 facilities subject to that section on and after the effective date
- 22 of this Act. The minimum number of inservice training hours
- 23 provided before the effective date of this Act is governed by the
- 24 law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and

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- 1 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
