| 12 | emergency services agencies, law enforcement agencies, health      |
| 13 | departments, and fire departments.                                 |
| 14 | (b) A panic alert device provided by a school district or          |
| 15 | open-enrollment charter school under this section does not satisfy |
| 16 | the requirement under Section 37.108(a)(2) for the district or     |
| 17 | school to ensure employees have classroom access to a telephone or |
| 18 | another electronic communication device.                           |
| 19 | (c) To comply with this section, a school district or              |
| 20 | open-enrollment charter school may:                                |

- 2 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026
- 3 school year.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
