1-19 relating to the recipients of opioid antagonists under the opioid
 1-20 antagonist program.

1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Section [461A.059\(c\)](#), Health and Safety Code, is
 1-23 amended to read as follows:

1-24 (c) The executive commissioner may provide opioid
 1-25 antagonists under the program to emergency medical services
 1-26 personnel, first responders, public schools, institutions of
 1-27 higher education as defined by Section [481.134](#), community centers,
 1-28 and other persons likely to be in a position to respond to an opioid
 1-29 overdose.

1-30 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
 1-31 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 1-32 provided by Section [39](#), Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 1-33 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 1-34 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
