## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the provision of certain intensive outpatient services
3	and partial hospitalization services under Medicaid.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 533.00255(a), Government Code, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(a) In this section <u>:</u>
8	(1) "Behavioral [, "behavioral] health services"
9	means mental health and substance <u>use</u> [abuse] disorder services.
10	The term includes intensive outpatient services and partial
11	hospitalization services.
12	(2) "Intensive outpatient services" means outpatient
13	treatment services, including treatment services for substance use
14	disorders, depression, eating disorders, and other mental health
15	conditions that do not require detoxification or 24-hour
16	supervision, provided to patients who require a time-limited,
17	multifaceted array of services, structures, and supports by a team
18	of clinical staff capable of providing, at a minimum, the following
19	services:
20	(A) individual counseling;
21	(B) group counseling;
22	(C) family counseling;
23	(D) motivational enhancement training; and
24	(E) relapse prevention, drug refusal, and coping

- 1 skills training.
- 2 (3) "Partial hospitalization services" means distinct
- 3 and organized intensive ambulatory treatment services provided for
- 4 periods of not more than 24 hours at a location other than a
- 5 patient's home or in an inpatient or a residential care setting.
- 6 The term includes the services described by 42 C.F.R. Section
- 7 410.43(a)(4).
- 8 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 9 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 10 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 11 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 12 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 13 waiver or authorization is granted.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
