- 2 relating to certain agreements with collective bargaining
- 3 organizations related to certain publicly funded public work

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 51.7761(b), Education Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (b) An institution awarding a public work contract funded
- 9 <u>in whole or in part</u> with state <u>or local governmental</u> money <u>or</u>
- 10 governmentally administered financial assistance, including the
- 11 issuance of debt guaranteed by this state or a local governmental
- 12 entity, money from ratepayers, or money from user fees, may not:
- 13 (1) prohibit, require, discourage, or encourage a
- 14 person bidding on the public work contract, including a contractor
- 15 or subcontractor, from entering into or adhering to an agreement
- 16 with a collective bargaining organization relating to the project;
- 17 or
- 18 (2) discriminate against a person described by
- 19 Subdivision (1) based on the person's involvement in the agreement,
- 20 including the person's:
- 21 (A) status or lack of status as a party to the
- 22 agreement; or
- 23 (B) willingness or refusal to enter into the
- 24 agreement.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 2269.0541(a), Government Code, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 (a) A governmental entity awarding a public work contract
- 4 funded <u>in whole or in part</u> with state <u>or local governmental</u> money <u>or</u>
- 5 governmentally administered financial assistance, including the
- 6 issuance of debt guaranteed by this state or a local governmental
- 7 entity, money from ratepayers, or money from user fees, may not:
- 8 (1) prohibit, require, discourage, or encourage a
- 9 person bidding on the public work contract, including a contractor
- 10 or subcontractor, from entering into or adhering to an agreement
- 11 with a collective bargaining organization relating to the project;
- 12 or
- 13 (2) discriminate against a person described by
- 14 Subdivision (1) based on the person's involvement in the agreement,
- 15 including the person's:
- 16 (A) status or lack of status as a party to the
- 17 agreement; or
- 18 (B) willingness or refusal to enter into the
- 19 agreement.
- 20 SECTION 3. The changes made by this Act to Section 51.7761,
- 21 Education Code, and Section 2269.0541, Government Code, apply only
- 22 to a public work contract for which an invitation for offers,
- 23 request for proposals, request for qualifications, or other similar
- 24 solicitation is first published or distributed on or after the
- 25 effective date of this Act. A public work contract for which an
- 26 invitation for offers, request for proposals, request for
- 27 qualifications, or other similar solicitation is first published or

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- 1 distributed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the
- 2 law in effect at the time the invitation, request, or other
- 3 solicitation is published or distributed, and the former law is
- 4 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
