## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the commitment order for individuals with intellectual
- 3 disabilities who are committed to state supported living centers.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Section 593.013, Health and
- 6 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 593.013. [REQUIREMENT OF] INTERDISCIPLINARY TEAM
- 8 RECOMMENDATION.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 593.013(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 (a) Except as provided by Section 593.0511, a [A] person may
- 12 not be admitted or committed to a residential care facility unless
- 13 an interdisciplinary team recommends that placement.
- SECTION 3. Section 593.041(d), Health and Safety Code, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 (d) Except as provided by Section 593.0511, a [A] person may
- 17 not be committed to the department for placement in a residential
- 18 care facility under this subchapter unless a report by an
- 19 interdisciplinary team recommending the placement has been
- 20 completed during the six months preceding the date of the court
- 21 hearing on the application. If the report and recommendations have
- 22 not been completed or revised during that period, the court shall
- 23 order the report and recommendations on receiving the application.
- SECTION 4. Section 593.050(d), Health and Safety Code, is

- 2 (d) The Texas Rules of Evidence apply. The results of the
- 3 determination of an intellectual disability and the current
- 4 interdisciplinary team report and recommendations, except in the
- 5 case of a long-term placement under Section 593.0511, shall be
- 6 presented in evidence.
- 7 SECTION 5. Subchapter C, Chapter 593, Health and Safety
- 8 Code, is amended by adding Section 593.0511 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 593.0511. LONG-TERM PLACEMENT WITHOUT
- 10 INTERDISCIPLINARY TEAM RECOMMENDATION. A court may commit a
- 11 proposed resident to long-term placement in a residential care
- 12 <u>facility without an interdisciplinary team recommendation under</u>
- 13 <u>Section 593.013</u> if the court determines beyond a reasonable doubt
- 14 that the proposed resident meets the requirements for commitment to
- 15 <u>a residential care facility under Section 593.052.</u>
- SECTION 6. Section 593.052(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 (a) A proposed resident may not be committed to a
- 19 residential care facility unless:
- 20 (1) the proposed resident is a person with an
- 21 intellectual disability;
- 22 (2) a petition to the court to issue a commitment order
- 23 by the guardian of the proposed resident or, if the proposed
- 24 resident is a minor, the parent of the proposed resident or the
- 25 current interdisciplinary team report and recommendations, if
- 26 applicable, show [evidence is presented showing] that because of
- 27 the proposed resident's intellectual disability, the proposed

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- 1 resident:
- 2 (A) represents a substantial risk of physical
- 3 impairment or injury to the proposed resident or others; or
- 4 (B) is unable to provide for and is not providing
- 5 for the proposed resident's most basic personal physical needs;
- 6 (3) the proposed resident cannot be adequately and
- 7 appropriately habilitated in an available, less restrictive
- 8 setting; and
- 9 (4) the residential care facility provides
- 10 habilitative services, care, training, and treatment appropriate
- 11 to the proposed resident's needs.
- 12 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
