## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Subchapter F, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
8	amended by adding Section 1701.2515 to read as follows:

- 9 Sec. 1701.2515. CERTIFICATE REQUIRED TO PROVIDE ACTIVE
  10 SHOOTER TRAINING AT PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER
  11 EDUCATION. (a) A person may not provide active shooter training to
  12 students or employees at a public primary or secondary school or an
  13 institution of higher education as defined by Section 61.003,
- 14 Education Code, unless the person is certified by the commission
- 15 under this section to provide active shooter training.
- 16 (b) The commission shall:
- 17 (1) establish a certification program for providers of active shooter training; and
- 19 (2) issue a certificate to a provider who completes
  20 the program established under Subdivision (1).
- (c) The commission shall adopt rules for the renewal of a certificate issued under this section. The commission may require continuing education for the renewal of the certificate.
- SECTION 2. Not later than September 1, 2024, the Texas

- 1 Commission on Law Enforcement shall establish the certification
- 2 program required by Section 1701.2515, Occupations Code, as added
- 3 by this Act.
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 1701.2515(a), Occupations Code, as added
- 5 by this Act, applies only to active shooter training provided on or
- 6 after December 1, 2024.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
