3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Title 5, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is
5	amended by adding Chapter 100C, to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 100C. CIVIL ACTIONS RELATED TO PUBLIC NUISANCES
7	Sec. 100C.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "public
8	nuisance claim" means a request in a civil action to recover
9	damages, abatement, or other relief under the common law tort of
10	<pre>public nuisance.</pre>
11	Sec. 100C.002. LIMITATIONS ON CAUSE OF ACTION. (a) A
12	public nuisance claim is not cognizable in this state if it seeks
13	relief arising from:
14	(1) an action or condition that is authorized,
15	licensed, approved, or mandated by a statute, ordinance,
16	regulation, permit, order, rule, or other similar measure issued,
17	adopted, promulgated, or approved by the federal government, a
18	federal agency, a state, a state agency, or a political
19	subdivision;
20	(2) an action or condition that occurs or exists in a
21	context where a statutory cause of action or administrative
22	enforcement mechanism already exists to address conduct that is

injurious to the public; or

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(3) a product or a claim based on the manufacturing,

- 1 distributing, selling, labeling, or marketing of a product,
- 2 regardless of whether the product is defective.
- 3 (b) The aggregation of multiple injuries to individuals or
- 4 of private nuisances does not constitute a public nuisance or give
- 5 rise to a public nuisance claim.
- 6 (c) This section may not be construed to limit a claimant
- 7 from obtaining relief provided by other law.
- 8 Sec. 100C.003. RELATIONSHIP TO COMMON LAW. To the extent of
- 9 a conflict between this chapter and common law, this chapter
- 10 controls. Otherwise, this chapter supplements the common law of
- 11 public nuisance, both as to the claim and defenses.
- 12 SECTION 2. Chapter 100C, Civil Practice and Remedies Code,
- 13 as added by this Act, applies only to a cause of action that accrues
- 14 on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
