4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter E-1, Chapter 1603, Occupations Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 1603.2110 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1603.2110. PROHIBITED PRACTICES. (a) Except as
8	provided by Subsection (b), a person performing a barbering or
9	cosmetology service within the scope of a license or permit issued
10	under this subchapter may not:
11	(1) make an incision into the dermis layer of a
12	person's skin, including for purposes of injecting a medication or
13	other substance; or
14	(2) use a prescription medical device approved by the
15	United States Food and Drug Administration.
16	(b) A person holding a license or permit issued under this
17	subchapter may perform an act described by Subsection (a) as part of
18	a barbering or cosmetology service if the person is licensed to
19	perform that act in this state or is otherwise authorized by law to
20	perform that act. In a disciplinary action by the commission
21	related to an act in violation of Subsection (a), the license or
22	permit holder has the burden of proving by a preponderance of the
23	evidence that the person is licensed or otherwise authorized to
24	perform the act.

1 (c) This section does not affect the authority of another 2 state agency regulating a profession to enforce any law related to 3 that profession.

SECTION 2. Section 1603.2110, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, applies only to conduct that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. Conduct that occurs before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the conduct occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
