- (b) A person holding a license or permit issued under this 16 subchapter may perform an act described by Subsection (a) as part of 17 a barbering or cosmetology service if the person is licensed to 18 perform that act in this state or is otherwise authorized by law to 19 perform that act. In a disciplinary action by the commission 20 related to an act in violation of Subsection (a), the license or 21 22 permit holder has the burden of proving by a preponderance of the evidence that the person is licensed or otherwise authorized to 23 24 perform the act.

- 1 (c) This section does not affect the authority of another
- 2 state agency regulating a profession to enforce any law related to
- 3 that profession.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 1603.2110, Occupations Code, as added by
- 5 this Act, applies only to conduct that occurs on or after the
- 6 effective date of this Act. Conduct that occurs before the
- 7 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 8 date the conduct occurred, and the former law is continued in effect
- 9 for that purpose.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
