- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 85.0011, Local Government Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 85.0011. QUALIFICATIONS FOR SHERIFF OR CANDIDATE FOR
- 7 SHERIFF. (a) In this section:
- 8 (1) "Active duty" means current full-time military
- 9 service in the armed forces of the United States.
- 10 (2) "Armed forces of the United States" means the
- 11 army, navy, air force, space force, coast guard, or marine corps of
- 12 the United States or a reserve unit of one of those branches of the
- 13 armed forces.
- 14 (3) "Federal special investigator" means a person
- 15 described by Article 2.122, Code of Criminal Procedure.
- 16 (4) "Military veteran" means a person who has served
- 17 on active duty and who was discharged or released from active duty.
- 18 (b) A person is not eligible to serve as sheriff unless the
- 19 person:
- 20 (1) has a high school diploma or a high school
- 21 equivalency certificate; and
- 22 (2) either:
- (A) holds an active permanent peace officer
- 24 license under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code; or

- 1 (B) is eligible to be licensed under Sections
- 2 1701.309 and 1701.312, Occupations Code, and:
- (i) has a minimum of five years of
- 4 <u>experience as a federal special investigator; or</u>
- 5 (ii) is a military veteran with a minimum of
- 6 10 years of combined active duty or national guard service
- 7 experience.
- 8 (c) A person is not eligible to be a candidate for the office
- 9 of sheriff unless the person holds an active permanent peace
- 10 officer license under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, or is a
- 11 person described by Subsection (b)(2)(B)(i) or (ii) and obtains a
- 12 license within the time provided by Section 1701.302(a),
- 13 Occupations Code.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 1701.302(a), Occupations Code, is
- 15 amended to read as follows:
- 16 (a) Except as provided by Section 85.0011, Local Government
- 17 <u>Code, an</u> [An] officer, including a sheriff, elected under the Texas
- 18 Constitution or a statute or appointed to fill a vacancy in an
- 19 elective office must obtain a license from the commission not later
- 20 than the second anniversary of the date the officer takes office.
- 21 SECTION 3. Section 85.0025, Local Government Code, is
- 22 repealed.
- 23 SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act to Sections
- 24 85.0011 and 85.0025, Local Government Code, do not apply to a
- 25 sheriff serving a term that began before the effective date of this
- 26 Act. A sheriff serving a term that began before the effective date
- 27 of this Act is governed for the remainder of that term by Sections

- 1 85.0011 and 85.0025, Local Government Code, as those laws existed
- $2\,\,$ immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the prior law
- 3 is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 4 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
