16	(e-7) If the commission, the department, or a child-placing
17	agency that contracts with the department has or obtains
18	information relating to the types of weapons, including firearms,
19	that are present in an agency foster home, the commission,
20	department, or child-placing agency may not use that information
21	for any purpose other than determining whether there are weapons
22	present in the home.
23	(e-8) A child-placing agency that violates Subsection (e-7)
24	is liable to the state for a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed

- 1 \$5,000 for each violation. The attorney general may bring an action
- 2 to recover a civil penalty authorized under this subsection.
- 3 (e-9) Information relating to the types of weapons,
- 4 including firearms, that are present in an agency foster home is
- 5 confidential and is not subject to disclosure under Chapter 552,
- 6 Government Code.
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
