3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 5, Business & Commerce Code, is
5	amended by adding Chapter 121 to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 121. ONLINE GLOBAL MARKETPLACES
7	Sec. 121.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "online global
8	marketplace" means a person that:
9	(1) provides for consideration, including
10	consideration deducted as a fee from the transaction, an online
11	application, software, an Internet website, a system, or another
12	medium through which a good or service in this state is advertised
13	or offered to the public as available; and
14	(2) is not regulated by this state; and
15	(3) directly or indirectly provides or maintains an
16	Internet platform for goods or services by:
17	(A) providing a payment system that facilitates a
18	transaction between two platform users;
19	(B) transmitting or otherwise communicating the
20	offer or acceptance of a transaction between two platform users;
21	(C) owning or operating the electronic or
22	physical infrastructure or technology that brings two or more
23	<pre>platform users together;</pre>
24	(D) providing a virtual currency, as defined by

- 1 Section 12.001, that platform users are allowed or required to use
- 2 to transact; or
- 3 (E) providing software development or research
- 4 and development activities related to any of the activities
- 5 described by this subdivision.
- 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 250, Local Government Code, is amended
- 7 by adding Section 250.014 to read as follows:
- 8 <u>Sec. 250.014.</u> REGULATION OF ONLINE GLOBAL MARKETPLACE
- 9 PROHIBITED. (a) In this section, "online global marketplace" has
- 10 the meaning assigned by Section 121.001, Business & Commerce Code.
- 11 (b) A county or municipality may not:
- 12 (1) regulate the operation of an online global
- 13 marketplace; or
- 14 (2) require an online global marketplace to provide
- 15 personally identifiable information of its Internet platform users
- 16 without an administrative subpoena or court order.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
