An applicant for a license 13 14 under this section must: (1) present proof to the executive council that the 15 16 applicant is licensed in good standing as a psychologist or psychological associate, as applicable, in that jurisdiction; 17 18 (2) provide to the executive council information regarding the status of any other professional license that the 19 applicant holds or has held in this state or another jurisdiction; 20 21 (3) present proof to the executive council that the applicant has passed a jurisprudence examination required by the 22 23 executive council; 24 (4) meet the qualifications required by Section

No. 1491 (1) present proof to the executive council that the 1 2 applicant is licensed in good standing as a professional counselor 3 in that jurisdiction; 4 (2) provide to the executive council information regarding the status of any other professional license that the 5 applicant holds or has held in this state or another jurisdiction; 6 7 (3) present proof to the executive council that the applicant has passed a jurisprudence examination required by the 8 executive council; 9 10 (4) meet the qualifications required by Section 503.302; 11 12 (5) not have committed an act that is grounds for disciplinary action under Section 503.401; 13 14 (6) submit to the executive council a current 15 photograph that meets the requirements for a United States 16 passport; and 17 (7) meet any additional requirements provided by executive council rule. 18 (b) The executive council shall adopt rules for issuing a 19 provisional license under Section 503.310 to an applicant for a 20 license by endorsement who encounters a delay that is outside the 21 applicant's control in submitting to the executive council the 22 documentation required by this section. 23 24 SECTION 4. Not later than December 1, 2023, the Texas 25 Behavioral Health Executive Council shall adopt the rules necessary to implement the changes in law made by this Act. 26 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023. 27
