2	relating to the authority of certain special districts and
3	corporations created by certain special districts to exercise

5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle Z, Title 10, Government Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 3001 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 3001. LIMITATION OF RIGHTS AND POWERS OF CERTAIN SPECIAL
9	DISTRICTS AND CORPORATIONS
10	Sec. 3001.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
11	(1) "Corporation" and "special district" have the
12	meanings assigned by Section 303.003, Local Government Code.
13	(2) "Private entity" has the meaning assigned by
14	Section 2267.001.
15	Sec. 3001.002. CERTAIN RIGHTS AND POWERS LIMITED TO
16	BOUNDARIES. (a) Notwithstanding any other law and except as
17	provided by Subsection (d), on or after September 1, 2023:
18	(1) a special district or a corporation created by a
19	special district may not acquire, purchase, construct,
20	rehabilitate, renovate, repair, equip, furnish, finance, own, or
21	lease a multifamily residential development located outside the
22	district's boundaries; and
23	(2) a corporation created by a special district may
24	not grant a leasehold or other possessory interest in real property

- 1 outside the district's boundaries to a private entity if the
- 2 leasehold or other interest would result in an exemption from ad
- 3 valorem taxation under Section 303.042, Local Government Code, for
- 4 the private entity.
- 5 (b) A contract, agreement, or action of a special district
- 6 or a corporation created by a special district that violates
- 7 Subsection (a) is void.
- 8 <u>(c) This section prevails over a special law governing a</u>
- 9 special district.
- 10 (d) This chapter does not diminish or impair the rights of
- 11 the holders of any outstanding and unpaid debts, bonds, warrants,
- 12 or other obligations of a special district or a corporation created
- 13 by a special district. After September 1, 2023, a special district
- 14 or a corporation created by a special district may continue to
- 15 exercise a right or power prohibited by Subsection (a) outside the
- 16 district as provided by other law only as necessary to pay or
- 17 <u>fulfill any outstanding and unpaid debts, bonds, warrants, or other</u>
- 18 obligations.
- 19 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
