4	SECTION 1. Sections 545.356(b-1), (c), and (d),
5	Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows:
6	(b-1) Except as provided by Subsection (b-3), the governing
7	body of a municipality, for a highway or a part of a highway in the
8	municipality that is not an officially designated or marked highway
9	or road of the state highway system, may declare a lower speed limit
10	of not less than $\underline{20}$ [$\underline{25}$] miles per hour, if the governing body
11	determines that the prima facie speed limit on the highway is

12 unreasonable or unsafe. <u>A municipality is not required to perform</u> 13 <u>an engineering or traffic investigation to declare a lower speed</u> 14 <u>limit under this subsection if the street is located in a residence</u> 15 <u>district.</u>

16 (c) A prima facie speed limit that is altered by the 17 governing body of a municipality under Subsection (b)[, (b-1),] or 18 (b-3) is effective when the governing body erects signs giving 19 notice of the new limit and at all times or at other times as 20 determined.

(d) The governing body of a municipality that declares a lower speed limit on a highway or part of a highway under Subsection [(b-1) or] (b-3), not later than February 1 of each year, shall publish on its Internet website and submit to the department a

1 report that compares for each of the two previous calendar years: 2 (1) the number of traffic citations issued by peace 3 officers of the municipality and the alleged speed of the vehicles, 4 for speed limit violations on the highway or part of the highway;

5 (2) the number of warning citations issued by peace 6 officers of the municipality on the highway or part of the highway; 7 and

8 (3) the number of vehicular accidents that resulted in 9 injury or death and were attributable to speed limit violations on 10 the highway or part of the highway.
