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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of the school safety technical
3	advisory committee and the school safety accountability program.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 37, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter H to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER H. SCHOOL SAFETY ACCOUNTABILITY PROGRAM
8	Sec. 37.251. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Advisory committee" means the school safety
10	technical advisory committee established under Section 37.252.
11	(2) "Chief of school safety and security" means the
12	individual appointed by the governor as chief of school safety and
13	security for the agency.
14	(3) "Law enforcement leadership officer" means:
15	(A) the chief of police of a school district
16	police department;
17	(B) the chief or deputy chief of police of a
18	<pre>municipality;</pre>
19	(C) a sheriff;
20	(D) a constable; or
21	(E) a highway patrol officer:
22	(i) designated by the public safety
23	director of the Department of Public Safety; and
24	(ii) who holds a rank of lieutenant or

1	higher.
2	(4) "Program" means the school safety accountability
3	program established under this subchapter.
4	(5) "School exterior" means the outer walls, doors,
5	and windows of a school district or open-enrollment charter school
6	facility.
7	(6) "School guardian" means a person who, pursuant to
8	the written regulations or written authorization of a school
9	district or open-enrollment charter school under Section
10	46.03(a)(1)(A), Penal Code, is authorized to carry or possess a
11	specified weapon for the purpose of providing safety and security
12	on the physical premises of a school, any grounds or building on
13	which an activity sponsored by a school is being conducted, or a
14	passenger transportation vehicle of a school.
15	(7) "School interior" means the area inside of a
16	school district or open-enrollment charter school facility's outer
17	walls, including the facility's interior doors.
18	(8) "School perimeter" means the boundaries of the
19	real property or site on which a school district or open-enrollment
20	charter school campus is located.
21	(9) "School safety rating" means a school safety
22	accountability rating assigned under Section 37.258 to a school
23	district or open-enrollment charter school campus based on the
24	campus's school safety score.
25	(10) "School safety score" means the numeric school
26	safety score assigned to a school district or open-enrollment
27	charter school campus under Section 37.254.

1 Sec. 37.252. SCHOOL SAFETY TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE. 2 (a) The agency shall establish the school safety technical advisory committee to advise the agency regarding the school safety 3 accountability program established under this subchapter. 4 The committee is composed of: 5 6 (1) the following nine members, with the governor, the 7 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives each appointing one member from each of the 8 9 following three categories: 10 (A) public school superintendents; 11 (B) law enforcement leadership officers; and 12 (C) persons serving in a school safety leadership 13 capacity other than as a law enforcement leadership officer; and (2) two additional members appointed by the 14 15 commissioner, one of whom must be a teacher at a school district or 16 open-enrollment charter school. (b) An individual may not be appointed under Subsection (a) 17 to serve on the committee as a law enforcement leadership officer 18 unless the individual has completed the initial training program 19 20 required by police chiefs under Section 96.641 and any continuing education required for police chiefs under that section. 21 22 (c) A committee member serves a two-year term and may be 23 reappointed. Sec. 37.253. ESTABLISHMENT OF PROGRAM. (a) The agency 24 25 shall establish a school safety accountability program to ensure school district and open-enrollment charter school campuses 26 27 provide safe and secure environments.

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1 (b) The chief of school safety and security shall oversee 2 and administer the program. (c) The chief of school safety and security may lower a 3 school safety score assigned under Section 37.254 or school safety 4 rating based on a final audit report prepared by the agency under 5 Section 37.255. A decision by the chief of school safety and 6 7 security under this subsection is final and not subject to appeal. Sec. 37.254. SCHOOL SAFETY SCORE. (a) Not later than 8 9 January 30 of each year, the agency shall assign each school district and open-enrollment charter school campus a school safety 10 11 score. The school safety score must be: (1) a number between zero and 100, with 12 100 13 representing a perfect score; and (2) determined by an audit of campus school safety 14 based on the metrics of assessment developed under Section 37.256 15 16 conducted by: 17 (A) the district or school under Subsection (b); 18 or 19 (B) the agency under Section 37.255. 20 (b) Each school district and open-enrollment charter school shall annually conduct an audit of the safety of each campus of the 21 district or school applying the metrics of assessment developed 22 23 under Section 37.256 to assign a school safety score to each campus. The district or school shall submit the campus school safety score 24 25 assigned for each campus under this subsection to the agency in the manner and form required by the commissioner. 26 27 Sec. 37.255. AGENCY AUDIT OF SCHOOL SAFETY. (a) The agency

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1	shall annually conduct an audit of the school safety of 25 percent
2	of school district and open-enrollment charter school campuses in
3	this state. The audit must:
4	(1) apply the metrics of assessment developed under
5	Section 37.256; and
6	(2) assess the accuracy of school safety scores
7	submitted for the audited campus by a school district or
8	open-enrollment charter school under Section 37.254 for the
9	preceding three years.
10	(b) After completing an audit of a school district or
11	open-enrollment charter school campus under this section, the
12	agency shall provide a preliminary school safety audit report to
13	the district or school. The audited district or school may respond
14	in writing to the preliminary audit report.
15	(c) After issuing a preliminary audit report and
16	considering any response submitted by the school district or
17	open-enrollment charter school, the agency shall issue to the
18	district or school a final audit report of each audited campus that
19	includes a school safety score. A final audit report issued under
20	this section is not subject to appeal.
21	Sec. 37.256. METRICS OF ASSESSMENT. (a) The agency, in
22	consultation with the advisory committee, the Texas School Safety
23	Center, the Advanced Law Enforcement Rapid Response Training Center
24	at Texas State UniversitySan Marcos, and other appropriate
25	stakeholders designated by the commissioner, shall develop
26	criteria for metrics of assessment to be applied in calculating
27	school safety scores under Sections 37.254 and 37.255 for each

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1	school district and open-enrollment charter school campus.
2	(b) The metrics of assessment must, with respect to each
3	school district and open-enrollment charter school campus:
4	(1) evaluate separately each school perimeter,
5	exterior, and interior at the district or school; and
6	(2) include metrics for evaluating:
7	(A) whether all classroom and exterior doors
8	<u>lock;</u>
9	(B) the type of glass used in interior and
10	exterior windows, which may be divided into further categories
11	requiring the application of additional metrics;
12	(C) the type and location of exterior cameras
13	installed at the campus;
14	(D) the type and location of interior cameras
15	installed at the campus;
16	(E) the features of any school safety Internet
17	application used by the school, including if:
18	(i) a school lockdown or threat
19	automatically triggers the application to call or make a digital
20	directive announcement to the local 9-1-1 emergency call center;
21	(ii) the application integrates with
22	information reported through the Public Education Information
23	Management System (PEIMS); or
24	(iii) the application integrates with the
25	health information of school staff and students as necessary for
26	providing effective emergency medical treatment following a
27	disaster or emergency situation, including a staff member's or

student's blood type, medication allergies, and significant 1 2 diseases or health conditions; 3 (F) the frequency and type of active shooter and 4 other disaster drills; 5 (G) the security of exterior gates and fencing; the ease of access to the campus for an 6 (H) 7 intruder; 8 (I) safety procedures for student pick-up and 9 drop-off at the campus; 10 (J) the safety of campus parking lots used by 11 visitors and faculty; (K) severe weather and disaster alerts and 12 13 preparedness; (L) the availability of devices allowing for 14 two-way communication between campus administrators or campus 15 police, if applicable, and each classroom; 16 17 (M) the safety and storage of firearms at each 18 campus; (N) the provision of security services at each 19 20 campus for which a school marshal is appointed or at which a school 21 guardian is authorized; 22 (O) for a campus at which a school resource 23 officer is assigned, coverage of school resource officers; (P) for a campus at which peace officers 24 25 commissioned and employed by the district or school provide services, data related to commissioned district or school peace 26 27 officers, including demographic information and information

No. 1664 1 concerning training and experience; 2 (Q) wireless Internet access, speed, and availability on campus; 3 4 (R) information regarding the campus reported to 5 the agency under Section 38.0141; and 6 (S) any other safety criteria required by the 7 agency. (c) In developing criteria for the metrics of assessment 8 under Subsection (a), the agency shall account for differences 9 among school district and open-enrollment charter school campuses 10 11 located in rural, urban, and suburban areas, including by differentiating how metrics evaluated under Subsection (b)(2) are 12 13 applied in determining those differences. Sec. 37.257. SCHOOL SAFETY MOBILE INTERNET APPLICATION 14 REQUIREMENTS. If a school district or open-enrollment charter 15 school provides a school safety mobile Internet application, the 16 17 application: 18 (1) must comply with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (42 U.S.C. Section 1320d et seq.) and 19 20 the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (20 U.S.C. 21 Section 1232g); and 22 (2) may only contain health information voluntarily provided for integration in the application: 23 (A) for a student, by the student's parent or 24 25 guardian; or 26 (B) by an educator or other campus staff. 27 Sec. 37.258. SCHOOL SAFETY RATING. (a) The agency, with

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1	input from the advisory committee, shall adopt a method for
2	converting a school safety score assigned under Section 37.254 to a
3	school safety rating for purposes of this section.
4	(b) Not later than January 30 of each year, the agency shall
5	assign each school district and open-enrollment charter school
6	campus, based on that campus's school safety score, a preliminary
7	school safety rating of:
8	(1) exceeds standards;
9	(2) meets standards; or
10	(3) does not meet standards.
11	(c) Not later than March 1, the agency shall assign a final
12	school safety rating of "exceeds standards," "meets standards," or
13	"does not meet standards" to each school district and
14	open-enrollment charter school campus, except a campus
15	implementing a remediation plan under a deadline established by
16	Section 37.259(e).
17	Sec. 37.259. CAMPUS REMEDIATION PLAN. (a) The principal of
18	a school district or open-enrollment charter school campus assigned
19	a preliminary school safety rating under Section 37.258 of "does
20	not meet standards" shall prepare a campus remediation plan.
21	(b) A campus remediation plan must:
22	(1) specifically address improvements to school
23	safety to be made at the campus prior to the beginning of the
24	following school year;
25	(2) for a school district campus, be prepared in
26	coordination with the board of trustees of the district;
27	(3) be approved by the board of trustees of the school

1	district or the governing body of the open-enrollment charter
2	school in which the campus is located, as applicable; and
3	(4) be submitted to the agency not later than the 45th
4	day after the date on which the preliminary school safety rating was
5	assigned.
6	(c) The chief of school safety and security shall evaluate
7	each campus remediation plan submitted under Subsection (b). If
8	the chief of school safety and security determines that a plan is
9	sufficient, the chief of school safety and security shall revise
10	the school safety rating assigned to the campus to the rating of
11	"meets standards."
12	(d) The agency shall notify the principal of the campus
13	whether the remediation plan is sufficient for the campus to be
14	assigned a revised school safety rating of "meets standards."
15	(e) After a remediation plan is determined to be sufficient
16	under this section, the advisory committee shall establish a
17	deadline by which the principal of a school district or
18	open-enrollment charter school must submit to the board of trustees
19	of the district or governing board of the school, as applicable,
20	documentation showing that the campus has implemented the
21	remediation plan.
22	(f) The chief of school safety and security has the sole
23	authority to revise a school safety rating under this section.
24	Sec. 37.260. CONFIDENTIALITY. The following information
25	produced under this subchapter is confidential and not subject to
26	disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code:
27	(1) a school safety score, including data collected or

1	an audit report prepared by or in connection with determining or
2	assigning the school safety score;
3	(2) a preliminary school safety rating assigned under
4	Section 37.258; and
5	(3) a campus remediation plan prepared by a school
6	district or open-enrollment charter school under Section 37.259.
7	Sec. 37.261. RULES; DEADLINES. (a) The commissioner shall
8	adopt rules necessary to implement this subchapter, including rules
9	regarding requirements for further remediation by a school district
10	or open-enrollment charter school campus that submits a remediation
11	plan that is determined to be insufficient for purposes of Section
12	37.259.
13	(b) The commissioner may extend or modify a timeline or
14	deadline established by this subchapter.
15	Sec. 37.262. TEXAS SCHOOL SAFETY REPORT CARD. (a) Not
16	later than August 15 of each year, the agency shall publish on the
17	agency's Internet website the school safety report card, which
18	consists of a list of the most recently assigned final school safety
19	ratings under Section 37.258 for each school district and
20	open-enrollment charter school campus in the state.
21	(b) Each school district and open-enrollment charter school
22	shall annually provide either a copy of the school safety report
23	card or a link to the report card on the agency's Internet website
24	to each parent, guardian, or person standing in parental relation
25	to a student in the district or school.
26	SECTION 2. (a) Not later than October 1, 2023, the
27	commissioner of education shall establish the school safety

technical advisory committee required under Section 37.252,
 Education Code, as added by this Act.

3 (b) Not later than January 30, 2026, the Texas Education 4 Agency shall assign each school district and open-enrollment 5 charter school campus:

6 (1) a school safety score under Section 37.254,
7 Education Code, as added by this Act; and

8 (2) a school safety rating under Section 37.258,
9 Education Code, as added by this Act.

10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
