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   annually statistics derived from incident reports that relate to
   the number, cause, and location of the reported incidents.
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         (f) The department when releasing information under
   Subsection (d)(4)(J) or (K):
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               (1) may not release the personal identifying
   information, as defined by Section 521.002(a), Business & Commerce

- 12 SECTION 3. Section 31.132, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 31.132. REPORTING PROCEDURES FOR ENFORCEMENT
- 15 OFFICERS. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a [A] marine
- 16 safety enforcement officer shall provide to the department on a
- 17 form prescribed by the department a report of any incident the
- 18 officer investigates that involves a boating accident, water
- 19 fatality, or person who allegedly operates a boat while
- 20 intoxicated. The officer shall provide the report not later than
- 21 the 15th day after the date the officer initially became aware of
- 22 the incident.
- (b) This section does not apply to an incident that is
- 24 required to be reported under Section 31.105(c).
- 25 SECTION 4. Section 31.105, Parks and Wildlife Code, as
- 26 amended by this Act, applies only to an incident described by
- 27 Subsection (a) of that section that occurs on or after the effective
