4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 303.003(b-1), Labor Code, is amended to

6 read as follows:

7 (b-1) The commission by rule may establish and develop additional job incentive programs that use the skills development 8 9 fund to create incentives for public community and technical colleges in partnership with one or more employers, including 10 prospective employers who commit to establishing a place of 11 12 business in this state, to provide workforce training in an effort to create and retain employment opportunities in this state. Under 13 14 a program established under this subsection, the commission may commit money to a prospective employer described by this subsection 15 16 contingent on the employer's establishment of a place of business in this state. The rules must provide a procedure under which a 17 prospective employer described by this subsection may seek and 18 obtain direct reimbursement from the skills development fund for 19 costs incurred by the employer in relation to training provided to 20 21 new employees on the employer's demonstration that the training is proprietary and protected by trademark, patent, or copyright. rules must provide that the employer may be reimbursed for each new

employee receiving the proprietary training.
