## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the universal service fund. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: Δ SECTION 1. Section 56.023, Utilities Code, is amended by amending Subsections (f), (g), (h), (i), and (k) and adding 5 6 Subsections (q), (t), and (u) to read as follows: 7 Except as provided by Subsection (g), for an incumbent (f) 8 local exchange company or cooperative that served greater than 31,000 access lines in this state on September 1, 2022 [2013], or a 9 company or cooperative that is a successor to such a company or 10 cooperative, the support that the company or cooperative 11 is 12 eligible to receive on December 31, 2023 [2016], under a plan 13 established under Section 56.021(1)(A) is reduced: 14 (1) on January 1, 2024 [2017], to 75 percent of the 15 level of support the company or cooperative is eligible to receive on December 31, 2023 [2016]; 16 on January 1, 2025 [2018], to 50 percent of the 17 (2) level of support the company or cooperative is eligible to receive 18 on December 31, 2023 [2016]; [and] 19

(3) on January 1, <u>2026</u> [<del>2019</del>], to 25 percent of the
21 level of support the company or cooperative is eligible to receive
22 on December 31, <u>2023; and</u>

23 (4) on January 1, 2027, to zero percent of the level of
 24 support the company or cooperative is eligible to receive on

## 1 <u>December 31, 2023</u> [<del>2016</del>].

2 (g) After the commission has adopted rules under Subsection (j), an incumbent local exchange company or cooperative that is 3 4 subject to Subsection (f) may petition the commission to initiate a contested case proceeding as necessary to determine the eligibility 5 of the company or cooperative to receive support under a plan 6 7 established under Section 56.021(1)(A). A company or cooperative may not file more than one petition under this subsection. 8 On receipt of a petition under this subsection, the commission shall 9 10 initiate a contested case proceeding to determine the eligibility 11 of the company or cooperative to receive continued support under a plan established under Section 56.021(1)(A) for service in the 12 exchanges that are the subject of the petition. To be eligible to 13 receive support for service in an exchange under this subsection, 14 15 the company or cooperative must demonstrate that it has a financial 16 need for continued support. The commission must issue a final order on the proceeding not later than the 330th day after the date the 17 petition is filed with the commission. Until the commission issues 18 a final order on the proceeding, the company or cooperative is 19 20 entitled to receive the total amount of support the company or cooperative was eligible to receive on the date the company or 21 22 cooperative filed the petition. A company or cooperative that files a petition under this subsection is not subject to Subsection 23 24 (f) after the commission issues a final order on the proceeding. Ιf 25 the commission determines that a company or cooperative has demonstrated financial need for continued support under this 26 27 subsection, it shall set the amount of support in the same

proceeding. The amount of support set by the commission for an
 exchange under this subsection may not exceed:

3 (1) 100 percent of the amount of support that the
4 company or cooperative will be eligible to receive on December 31,
5 2023 [2016], if the petition is filed before January 1, 2024 [2016];

(2) 75 percent of the amount of support that the
company or cooperative will be eligible to receive on December 31,
<u>2023</u> [<del>2016</del>], if the petition is filed on or after January 1, <u>2024</u>
[<del>2016</del>], and before January 1, <u>2025</u> [<del>2017</del>];

10 (3) 50 percent of the amount of support the company or 11 cooperative is eligible to receive on December 31, <u>2023</u> [<del>2016</del>], if 12 the petition is filed on or after January 1, <u>2025</u> [<del>2017</del>], and before 13 January 1, <u>2026</u> [<del>2018</del>]; [<del>or</del>]

(4) 25 percent of the amount of support that the
company or cooperative is eligible to receive on December 31, <u>2023</u>
[<del>2016</del>], if the petition is filed on or after January 1, <u>2026</u> [<del>2018</del>],
and before January 1, <u>2027; or</u>

18 (5) zero percent of the amount of support that the 19 company or cooperative is eligible to receive on December 31, 2023, 20 if the petition is filed on or after January 1, 2027, and before 21 January 1, 2028 [2019].

(h) Except as provided by Subsection (i), for an incumbent local exchange company that is an electing company under Chapter 58 or 59 or a cooperative that served greater than 31,000 access lines in this state on September 1, <u>2022</u> [<del>2013</del>], or a company or cooperative that is a successor to such a company or cooperative, the support that the company or cooperative is eligible to receive

1 on December 31, 2024 [2017], under a plan established under Section
2 56.021(1)(B) is reduced:

3 (1) on January 1, <u>2025</u> [<del>2018</del>], to 75 percent of the 4 level of support the company or cooperative is eligible to receive 5 on December 31, <u>2024</u> [<del>2017</del>];

6 (2) on January 1, <u>2026</u> [<del>2019</del>], to 50 percent of the 7 level of support the company or cooperative is eligible to receive 8 on December 31, <u>2024</u> [<del>2017</del>]; [<del>and</del>]

9 (3) on January 1, <u>2027</u> [<del>2020</del>], to 25 percent of the 10 level of support the company or cooperative is eligible to receive 11 on December 31, <u>2024; and</u>

12 (4) on January 1, 2028, to zero percent of the level of 13 support the company or cooperative is eligible to receive on 14 December 31, 2024 [2017].

15 (i) After the commission has adopted rules under Subsection 16 (j), an incumbent local exchange company or cooperative that is subject to Subsection (h) may petition the commission to initiate a 17 contested case proceeding as necessary to determine the eligibility 18 of the company or cooperative to receive support under a plan 19 20 established under Section 56.021(1)(B). A company or cooperative may not file more than one petition under this subsection. 21 On receipt of a petition under this subsection, the commission shall 22 initiate a contested case proceeding to determine the eligibility 23 24 of the company or cooperative to receive continued support under a plan established under Section 56.021(1)(B) for service in the 25 exchanges that are the subject of the petition. To be eligible to 26 27 receive support for service in an exchange under this subsection,

the company or cooperative must demonstrate that it has a financial 1 2 need for continued support. The commission must issue a final order on the proceeding no later than the 330th day after the date the 3 4 petition is filed with the commission. Until the commission issues a final order on the proceeding, the company or cooperative shall 5 continue to receive the total amount of support it was eligible to 6 7 receive on the date the company or cooperative filed a petition under this subsection. A company or cooperative that files a 8 9 petition under this subsection is not subject to Subsection (h) 10 after the commission issues a final order on the proceeding. If the that 11 commission determines а company or cooperative has demonstrated financial need for continued support under this 12 13 subsection, it shall set the amount of support in the same The amount of support set by the commission for an 14 proceeding. 15 exchange under this subsection may not exceed:

16 (1) 100 percent of the amount of support that the 17 company or cooperative will be eligible to receive on December 31, 18 <u>2024</u> [<del>2017</del>], if the petition is filed before January 1, <u>2025</u> [<del>2017</del>];

(2) 75 percent of the amount of support that the
company or cooperative will be eligible to receive on December 31,
<u>2024</u> [<del>2017</del>], if the petition is filed on or after January 1, <u>2025</u>
[<del>2017</del>], and before January 1, <u>2026</u> [<del>2018</del>];

(3) 50 percent of the amount of support that the
company or cooperative is eligible to receive on December 31, <u>2024</u>
[<del>2017</del>], if the petition is filed on or after January 1, <u>2026</u> [<del>2018</del>],
and before January 1, <u>2027</u> [<del>2019</del>]; [<del>or</del>]

27 (4) 25 percent of the amount of support that the

company or cooperative is eligible to receive on December 31, <u>2024</u>
 [2017], if the petition is filed on or after January 1, <u>2027</u> [2019],
 and before January 1, <u>2028; or</u>

4 (5) zero percent of the amount of support that the
5 company or cooperative is eligible to receive on December 31, 2024,
6 if the petition is filed on or after January 1, 2028, and before
7 January 1, 2029 [2020].

Subsections (g) and (i) do not authorize the commission 8 (k) 9 to initiate a contested case hearing concerning a local exchange company that has elected to participate in a total support 10 11 reduction plan under 16 T.A.C. Section 26.403 that requires the company to forego funding under a plan established under Section 12 13 56.021(1) after January 1, 2024 [2017]. This section does not affect any obligation of a local exchange company subject to such a 14 15 total support reduction plan.

16 (q) Notwithstanding the period for continued support specified by Subsection (p), if the eligible telecommunications 17 provider receiving continued support under that subsection is a 18 cooperative or an affiliate of a cooperative, 19 the 20 telecommunications provider is entitled to continued support through December 31, 2023, at the same monthly per line support 21 amount as the provider is receiving as of the date the support 22 ceases for that exchange for the incumbent local exchange company 23 or cooperative. Support authorized under this subsection ceases 24 25 December 31, 2023.

(t) Not later than September 1 of every fourth year
 beginning September 1, 2023, the commission shall review and may

1 <u>adjust the standards and criteria to demonstrate financial need for</u> 2 <u>continued support under Subsection (f).</u>

3 <u>(u) Not later than September 1 of every fourth year</u> 4 <u>beginning September 1, 2024, the commission shall review and may</u> 5 <u>adjust the standards and criteria to demonstrate financial need for</u> 6 <u>continued support under Subsection (h).</u>

SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 56, Utilities Code, is
amended by adding Sections 56.0231 and 56.0232 to read as follows:

9 <u>Sec. 56.0231.</u> SUPPORT EXPIRED. Support to an incumbent 10 <u>local exchange company or cooperative provided under Section 56.023</u> 11 <u>must be reduced on December 31, 2024, to zero percent of the amount</u> 12 <u>of support that the company or cooperative is eligible to receive on</u> 13 <u>that date if before December 31, 2022, support to the company or</u> 14 <u>cooperative had been reduced to 25 percent of the support the</u> 15 <u>company or cooperative was eligible to receive.</u>

16 <u>Sec. 56.0232.</u> SUPPORT RELINQUISHED. (a) An eligible 17 <u>telecommunications provider may notify the commission that the</u> 18 <u>provider relinquishes the support it is entitled to receive under</u> 19 <u>this chapter. After notice by the provider, the commission shall</u> 20 <u>require the entity administering the universal service fund to</u> 21 <u>terminate support to the provider.</u>

(b) If the commission does not notify the administrator under Subsection (a) of the provider's request before the 90th day after the date the commission receives the request, the provider is entitled to stop receiving the support on that date.

26 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
