4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 501, Labor Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 501.027 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 501.027. COVERAGE FOR POST-TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER
8	FOR FIRST RESPONDERS. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "First responder" means:
10	(A) an employee described by Section
11	501.001(5)(C), (D), (E), or (F); or
12	(B) an employee who is:
13	(i) a person licensed under Chapter 773,
14	Health and Safety Code, as an emergency care attendant, emergency
15	medical technician, emergency medical technician-intermediate,
16	emergency medical technician-paramedic, or licensed paramedic; or
17	(ii) a firefighter subject to certification
18	by the Texas Commission on Fire Protection under Chapter 419,
19	Government Code, whose principal duties are firefighting and
20	aircraft crash and rescue.
21	(2) "Post-traumatic stress disorder" means a disorder
22	that meets the diagnostic criteria for post-traumatic stress
23	disorder specified by the American Psychiatric Association in the
24	Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, fifth

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1	edition, or a later edition adopted by the commissioner of workers'
2	compensation.
3	(b) Post-traumatic stress disorder suffered by a first
4	responder is a compensable injury under this subtitle only if it is

9	(2) the preponderance of the evidence indicates that
10	the event or events were a producing cause of the disorder.

(a) In this section: 6 7 (1) "First responder" means an employee who is: 8 (A) a peace officer under Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure; 9 10 (B) a person licensed under Chapter 773, Health and Safety Code, as an emergency care attendant, emergency medical 11 12 technician, emergency medical technician-intermediate, emergency medical technician-paramedic, or licensed paramedic; or 13 14 (C) a firefighter subject to certification by the 15 Texas Commission on Fire Protection under Chapter 419, Government Code, whose principal duties are firefighting and aircraft crash 16 17 and rescue. "Post-traumatic st<u>ress disorder" means a disorder</u> 18 (2) 19 that meets the diagnostic criteria for post-traumatic stress disorder specified by the American Psychiatric Association in the 20 Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, fifth 21 22 edition, or a later edition adopted by the commissioner of workers' 23 compensation. 24 (b) Post-traumatic stress disorder suffered by a first responder is a compensable injury under this subtitle only if it is 25 26 based on a diagnosis that: 27 (1) the disorder is caused by one or more events

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1 occurring in the course and scope of the first responder's
2 employment; and

3 (2) the preponderance of the evidence indicates that
4 the event or events were a producing cause of the disorder.

5 (c) For purposes of this subtitle, the date of injury for 6 post-traumatic stress disorder suffered by a first responder is the 7 date on which the first responder first knew or should have known 8 that the disorder may be related to the first responder's 9 employment.

10 SECTION 5. Section 408.006(b), Labor Code, is amended to 11 read as follows:

(b) Notwithstanding <u>Sections 501.027, 502.026, 503.026,</u> [Section] 504.019, <u>and 505.014,</u> a mental or emotional injury that arises principally from a legitimate personnel action, including a transfer, promotion, demotion, or termination, is not a compensable injury under this subtitle.

SECTION 6. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to a claim for workers' compensation benefits based on a compensable injury that occurs on or after the effective date of this Act. A claim based on a compensable injury that occurs before that date is governed by the law as it existed on the date the compensable injury occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

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SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
