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	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to establishing a social work recruitment and retention
3	program administered by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating
4	Board.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
7	Subchapter LL to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER LL. SOCIAL WORK RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION PROGRAM
9	Sec. 61.9851. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "program"
10	means the social work intern practicum stipend (SWIPS) program.
11	Sec. 61.9852. ESTABLISHMENT AND ADMINISTRATION OF PROGRAM.
12	The board shall establish and administer a social work recruitment
13	and retention program to provide an intern practicum stipend to
14	assist students at institutions of higher education in obtaining
15	field hours necessary for program coursework related to completing
16	a bachelor's or master's degree in social work.
17	Sec. 61.9853. ELIGIBILITY; PRIORITY OF APPLICANTS. (a) To
18	be eligible to receive a stipend under the program, a student must:
19	(1) apply to the board in the form and manner
20	prescribed by board rule;
21	(2) be enrolled at an institution of higher education
22	in an educational program that is accredited by the Council on
23	Social Work Education leading to a bachelor's or master's degree in
24	<pre>social work;</pre>

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1	(3) be accepted into a practicum placement approved by
2	the board for purposes of the program;
3	(4) enter into a written agreement with the board as
4	provided by board rule; and
5	(5) satisfy any other criteria prescribed by board
6	<u>rule.</u>
7	(b) The board shall establish a method for prioritizing
8	applicants for practicum stipends in the event the total amount of
9	money available to provide stipends under this subchapter for an
10	academic year is not sufficient to provide a stipend to each
11	applicant who is eligible under Subsection (a). The priority
12	criteria must include:
13	(1) qualification for need-based aid based on free
14	application for federal student aid (FAFSA) indicators; and
15	(2) practicum placement in a mental health
16	professional shortage area designated by the Department of State
17	Health Services.
18	Sec. 61.9854. PRACTICUM STIPEND AWARDS. (a) The amount of
19	a practicum stipend award to which an eligible student is entitled
20	is an amount equal to:
21	(1) for a student enrolled in a bachelor's degree
22	program, \$15 per hour for each hour of supervised field hours in an
23	approved practicum program, not to exceed a total of \$6,000; or
24	(2) for a student enrolled in a master's degree
25	program, \$20 per hour for each hour of supervised field hours in an
26	approved practicum program, not to exceed a total of \$9,000.
27	(b) Each academic year, the board shall provide money for

the practicum stipends to institutions of higher education with 1 Council on Social Work Education-accredited educational programs 2 based on the institution's anticipated need. Each institution shall 3 determine the timeline and procedure for distributing the money for 4 5 that academic year to eligible students based on the board's priority criteria adopted under Section 61.9853(b), if applicable. 6 7 (c) An institution of higher education shall remit to the 8 board any unused money received by the institution under the program for an academic year as soon as practicable following that 9 10 academic year. Sec. 61.9855. PRIORITY OF INSTITUTIONS. The board shall 11 12 establish a method for prioritizing institutions of higher education for distribution of practicum stipends in the event the 13 14 total amount of money available to provide stipends under this 15 subchapter for an academic year is not sufficient to provide money for stipends at each institution described by Section 61.9854(b). 16 17 The priority criteria shall include: (1) serving a high percentage of students who qualify 18 19 for need-based aid based on free application for federal student aid (FAFSA) indicators; 20 21 (2) having a high number of students who complete 22 practicum placements in mental health professional shortage areas 23 designated by the Department of State Health Services; and 24 (3) designation as a historically black college or university or a Hispanic-serving institution. 25 26 Sec. 61.9856. REPORTS. (a) Each institution of higher education that receives money for practicum stipends under the

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1 program for an academic year shall collect and submit data in the 2 form of a report to the board each semester. The report must include 3 information regarding: 4 (1) the amount of money distributed by the institution 5 under the program for that semester; 6 (2) the number of participants in the program during 7 that semester; and 8 (3) any other expenses incurred by the institution related to the program for that semester. 9 10 (b) Not later than September 1 of each even-numbered year, the board shall submit a report on the program to the governor, the 11 12 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, and each standing committee of the legislature with primary 13 jurisdiction over matters relating to finance. The report must 14 include an analysis of the program's effectiveness and any 15 recommendations for legislative or other action. 16 Sec. 61.9857. RULES. The board shall adopt rules necessary 17

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18 for the administration of this subchapter.

19 SECTION 2. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board 20 shall adopt rules for the administration of Subchapter LL, Chapter 21 61, Education Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable 22 after this Act takes effect.

23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
