4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle A, Title 3, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 117 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 117. TRAINING COURSE ON REPORTABLE DISEASES
8	Sec. 117.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services
10	Commission.
11	(2) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
12	commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
13	(3) "Qualifying health care practitioner" means an
14	individual who:
15	(A) holds a license, certificate, permit, or
16	other authorization issued under this title to engage in a health
17	care profession and who provides direct patient care; and
18	(B) is required to report a suspected reportable
19	disease to the local health authority under Section 81.042, Health
20	and Safety Code.
21	(4) "Reportable disease" has the meaning assigned by
22	Section 81.003, Health and Safety Code.
23	Sec. 117.002. REQUIRED TRAINING COURSE ON PROCEDURES FOR
24	REPORTABLE DISEASE REPORTING FOR CERTAIN HEALTH CARE

- 1 PRACTITIONERS. (a) A qualifying health care practitioner within
- 2 the time prescribed by commission rule shall complete a training
- 3 course approved by the executive commissioner on the procedures for
- 4 reportable disease reporting.
- 5 (b) The executive commissioner shall:
- 6 (1) approve training courses on the procedures for
- 7 reportable disease reporting; and
- 8 (2) post a list of the approved training courses on the
- 9 commission's Internet website.
- 10 (c) An approved training course under Subsection (b) may not
- 11 be less than three hours, and must include:
- 12 (1) information on the most recent list of reportable
- 13 diseases maintained under Section 81.041, Health and Safety Code;
- 14 (2) the reporting time requirements for each disease
- 15 on the list; and
- 16 (3) an overview of state agency rules relating to
- 17 reportable diseases.
- 18 <u>(d) The executive commissioner shall update the list of</u>
- 19 approved training courses described by Subsection (b) as necessary
- 20 and consider for approval training courses conducted by health care
- 21 <u>facilities.</u>
- Sec. 117.003. TRAINING REQUIRED FOR LICENSE RENEWAL. A
- 23 qualifying health care practitioner shall complete a training
- 24 course described by Section 117.002 as part of the practitioner's
- 25 continuing education requirements for renewal of a license,
- 26 certificate, permit, or other authorization issued to the health
- 27 care practitioner under this title.

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- 1 SECTION 2. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective
- 2 date of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
- 3 Services Commission shall adopt rules necessary to implement
- 4 Chapter 117, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 5 (b) Notwithstanding Section 117.002, Occupations Code, as
- 6 added by this Act, a health care practitioner is not required to
- 7 comply with that section before September 1, 2024.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
