A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a child's eligibility for the Medicaid buy-in program
- 3 for children or the medically dependent children (MDCP) waiver
- 4 program.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 531.02444, Government Code, is amended
- 7 by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (a) The executive commissioner shall develop and implement:
- 10 (1) a Medicaid buy-in program for persons with
- 11 disabilities as authorized by the Ticket to Work and Work
- 12 Incentives Improvement Act of 1999 (Pub. L. No. 106-170) or the
- 13 Balanced Budget Act of 1997 (Pub. L. No. 105-33); and
- 14 (2) subject to Subsection (a-1) as authorized by the
- 15 Deficit Reduction Act of 2005 (Pub. L. No. 109-171), a Medicaid
- 16 buy-in program for children with disabilities [that is] described
- 17 by 42 U.S.C. Section 1396a(cc)(1) whose family incomes do not
- 18 exceed 300 percent of the applicable federal poverty level.
- 19 <u>(a-1)</u> The executive commissioner by rule shall increase the
- 20 maximum family income prescribed by Subsection (a)(2) for
- 21 determining eligibility for the buy-in program to the maximum
- 22 <u>family income</u> amount allowable, considering available
- 23 appropriations for that purpose.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is

- 1 amended by adding Sections 531.024441 and 531.060111 to read as
- 2 follows:
- 3 Sec. 531.024441. MEDICAID BUY-IN PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN:
- 4 DISABILITY DETERMINATION ASSESSMENT. (a) The commission shall, at
- 5 the request of a child's legally authorized representative, conduct
- 6 a disability determination assessment of the child to determine the
- 7 <u>child's eligibility for the Medicaid buy-in program for children</u>
- 8 implemented under Section 531.02444.
- 9 (b) The commission shall directly conduct a disability
- 10 determination assessment of a child under this section and may not
- 11 contract with a managed care organization or other entity to
- 12 conduct the assessment.
- 13 Sec. 531.060111. MEDICALLY DEPENDENT CHILDREN PROGRAM
- 14 MEDICAL NECESSITY ASSESSMENT. (a) Notwithstanding Section
- 15 <u>531.0602</u> or any other law, the commission shall, at the request of
- 16 the legally authorized representative of a child who is in the first
- 17 position on the medically dependent children (MDCP) waiver program
- 18 interest list, conduct a medical necessity assessment of the child
- 19 to determine the child's eligibility for that waiver program.
- 20 (b) The commission shall directly conduct a medical
- 21 necessity assessment of a child under this section and may not
- 22 contract with a managed care organization or other entity to
- 23 <u>conduct the assessment.</u>
- SECTION 3. (a) Section 531.024441, Government Code, as
- 25 added by this Act, applies to a request for a disability
- 26 determination assessment to determine eligibility for the Medicaid
- 27 buy-in program for children made on or after the effective date of

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- 1 this Act.
- 2 (b) Section 531.060111, Government Code, as added by this
- 3 Act, applies to a request for a medical necessity assessment to
- 4 determine eligibility for the medically dependent children (MDCP)
- 5 waiver program made on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 4. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 7 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 8 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 9 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 10 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 11 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
