4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 41, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 41.0065 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 41.0065. REPORT TO ATTORNEY GENERAL REGARDING REFUSAL
8	TO PROSECUTE. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Peace officer" means an individual described by
10	Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure.
11	(2) "Prosecuting attorney" has the meaning assigned by
12	<u>Section 41.101.</u>
13	(b) If, after being presented with an affidavit sworn to by
14	a peace officer alleging that probable cause exists to believe a
15	person committed a criminal offense under Title 5 or 6, Penal Code,
16	or under Chapter 29, Penal Code, a prosecuting attorney refuses to
17	prosecute the alleged criminal offense, the prosecuting attorney
18	must submit a report to the attorney general that includes:
19	(1) any information the prosecuting attorney has
20	regarding the alleged criminal offense;
21	(2) a detailed explanation of the prosecuting
22	attorney's decision not to prosecute the alleged offense, including

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(3) the alleged offender's criminal history.

any perceived evidentiary deficiencies in the case; and

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(c) Subject to Subsection (d), at least once a month the 1 2 office of the attorney general shall post on the office's publicly accessible Internet website information regarding each prosecuting 3 4 attorney's decision not to prosecute an offense described by Subsection (b). The post must include: 5 6 (1) the county in which the alleged offense occurred; 7 (2) the type of offense alleged to have been 8 committed; and 9 (3) a short statement regarding the prosecuting attorney's rationale for refusing to prosecute the alleged offense. 10 (d) Information included on the attorney general's Internet 11 website under Subsection (c) may not include any personally 12 identifying information of an alleged offender or victim. 13

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
