A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to access to certain information in the adoption process
- 3 and information in certain investigations conducted by the
- 4 Department of Family and Protective Services.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Sections 162.005(b) and (c), Family Code, are
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (b) Before placing a child for adoption, the Department of
- 9 Family and Protective Services, a licensed child-placing agency, or
- 10 the child's parent or guardian shall compile a report on the
- 11 available health, social, educational, and genetic history of the
- 12 child to be adopted and distribute the report as required by this
- 13 <u>chapter</u>.
- 14 (c) The department shall ensure that each licensed
- 15 child-placing agency, single source continuum contractor, or other
- 16 person placing a child for adoption receives a copy of any portion
- 17 of the report prepared by the department not later than the 30th day
- 18 after the date the child's permanency plan is changed to include
- 19 <u>adoption</u>.
- SECTION 2. Section 162.0062, Family Code, is amended by
- 21 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (a-2) and (a-3) to
- 22 read as follows:
- 23 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (c), the prospective
- 24 adoptive parents of a child are entitled to examine the records and

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- 1 other information relating to the history of the child <u>including</u>
- 2 confidential information other than the identity of the biological
- 3 parents and any other person whose identity is confidential. The
- 4 Department of Family and Protective Services, licensed
- 5 child-placing agency, or other person placing a child for adoption
- 6 shall inform the prospective adoptive parents of their right to
- 7 examine the records and other information relating to the history
- 8 of the child. The department, licensed child-placing agency, or
- 9 other person placing the child for adoption shall edit the records
- 10 and information to protect the identity of the biological parents
- 11 and any other person whose identity is confidential.
- 12 <u>(a-2)</u> The department, licensed child-placing agency, or
- 13 other person placing the child for adoption may require a
- 14 prospective adoptive parent to sign a confidentiality agreement
- 15 before releasing confidential information under this section.
- 16 <u>(a-3)</u> The department, licensed child-placing agency, or
- 17 other person placing the child for adoption shall provide the
- 18 information under this section not later than the 90th day after the
- 19 date the information is requested.
- SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 40, Human Resources Code,
- 21 is amended by adding Section 40.0051 to read as follows:
- 22 <u>Sec. 40.0051. CONFIDENTIAL INVESTIGATION INFORMATION. The</u>
- 23 department shall, not later than the 90th day after a request is
- 24 made for information, produce all requested information related to
- 25 any investigation conducted by the department.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
