A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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2 relating to the information maintained by the Texas Education
3 Agency regarding postsecondary education and career opportunities.
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 7.040, Education Code, is amended by 6 amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (a-1) to

7 read as follows:

8 (a) The agency shall prepare information comparing institutions of higher education in this state and post the 9 information on the agency's Internet website. Information prepared 10 11 under this section shall be given to any $[\frac{1}{2}]$ public or private 12 school student who requests the information. The information 13 shall:

14 (1) identify postsecondary education and career 15 opportunities, including information that states the benefits of 16 four-year and two-year higher education programs, postsecondary 17 technical education, skilled workforce careers, and career 18 education programs;

19 (2) <u>assist prospective postsecondary students in</u> 20 <u>assessing the value of a certificate program, associate or</u> 21 <u>baccalaureate degree program, or other credential program offered</u> 22 <u>by an institution of higher education by comparing</u> [compare] each 23 institution [of higher education] with other institutions 24 regarding:

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1	(A) the relative cost of <u>obtaining the</u>
2	certificate, degree, or other credential, including:
3	(i) the total cost of attendance, based on
4	the most recent data released through the United States Department
5	of Education's College Scorecard online tool or a successor tool;
6	(ii) the total cost of tuition and fees;
7	(iii) the median cost of room and board;
8	(iv) the median student debt of students
9	who graduated with the certificate, degree, or other credential
10	from the institution as compared to the median student debt of all
11	students who graduated with the certificate, degree, or other
12	credential, based on the most recent data released through the
13	United States Department of Education's College Scorecard online
14	tool or a successor tool;
15	(v) the estimated monthly student loan
16	payment, computed using the standard 10-year repayment plan; and
17	(vi) the percentage of students who fully
18	repay student debt within the standard 10-year repayment period or,
19	if this information is not available for the program, the
20	percentage of students in all certificate programs, degree
21	programs, or other credential programs who fully repay student debt
22	within the standard 10-year repayment period [tuition];
23	(B) <u>educational outcomes for</u> [the retention rate
24	of] students seeking the certificate, degree, or other credential,
25	including:
26	(i) the percentage of students who continue
27	in the program after the first year of study;

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1	(ii) the graduation rate; and
2	(iii) the percentage of graduates employed
3	in a field related to the certificate program, degree program, or
4	other credential program within one year of graduation; and
5	(C) the median earnings of graduates, expressed
6	as a yearly amount and as a percentage of median student debt, based
7	on the most recent data released through the United States
8	Department of Education's College Scorecard online tool or a
9	<pre>successor tool [the graduation rate of students];</pre>
10	[(D) the average student debt;
11	[(E) the loan repayment rate of students; and
12	[(F) the employment rate of students;]
13	(3) identify the state's future workforce needs, as
14	projected by the Texas Workforce Commission; and
15	(4) include annual wage information for the top 10
16	highest demand jobs in this state, as identified by the Texas
17	Workforce Commission.
18	(a-1) The information required under Subsections
19	(a)(2)(A)(i), (iv), and (vi) and (a)(2)(C) must be updated each
20	time new data described by that provision is released through the
21	United States Department of Education's College Scorecard online
22	tool or a successor tool.
23	(c) Each institution of higher education shall:
24	(1) include on its Internet website, in a prominent
25	location that is not more than three hyperlinks from the website's
26	home page, a link to the information posted on the agency's Internet
27	website under Subsection (a); and
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<u>(2) disclose to a student on the student's enrollment</u>
 <u>in or transfer to a certificate program, associate or baccalaureate</u>
 <u>degree program, or other credential program at the institution the</u>
 <u>information posted on the agency's Internet website under</u>
 <u>Subsection (a) relating to the program</u>.
 SECTION 2. Section 2308A.007, Government Code, is amended
 by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:

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8 <u>(a-1) A credential library established under this section</u> 9 <u>must include the information described by Section 7.040(a)</u>, 10 <u>Education Code</u>.

11 SECTION 3. (a) As soon as practicable after the effective 12 date of this Act, the Texas Education Agency shall update the 13 information required under Section 7.040(a), Education Code, as 14 amended by this Act.

15 (b) As soon as practicable after the Texas Education Agency completes the update required by Subsection (a) of this section, 16 17 the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall update the comparative gainful employment data regarding public institutions 18 19 of higher education required to be maintained by the board under Sections 51.762(b-1) and 51.763(b), Education Code, to include the 20 information required under Section 7.040(a), Education Code, as 21 amended by this Act. 22

(c) As soon as practicable after the Texas Education Agency completes the update required by Subsection (a) of this section, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board and the Texas Workforce Commission shall jointly update the credential library established under Section 2308A.007, Government Code, to include

3 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
