5	SECTION 1. Sections 37.086(a), (b), and (c), Education
6	Code, are amended to read as follows:
7	(a) In this section, "school"[÷
8	[(1) "Premises" has the meaning assigned by Section
9	481.134, Health and Safety Code.
10	[(2) "School"] means a public [or private] primary or
11	secondary school.
12	(b) Each <u>public</u> school shall post warning signs of the
13	increased penalties for trafficking of persons under Section
14	20A.02(b-1)(2), Penal Code, in a [at the following locations:
15	[(1) parallel to and along the exterior boundaries of
16	the school's premises;
17	[(2) at each roadway or other way of access to the
18	premises;
19	[(3) for premises not fenced, at least every five
20	hundred feet along the exterior boundaries of the premises;
21	[(4) at each entrance to the premises; and
22	$[\frac{(5)}{at}]$ conspicuous <u>place</u> [places] reasonably likely
23	to be viewed by all <u>school employees and visitors</u> [persons entering
24	the premises].

- 1 (c) The agency, in consultation with the human trafficking
 2 prevention task force created under Section 402.035, Government
 3 Code, shall adopt rules regarding the [placement, installation,
 4 design, size,] wording[, and maintenance procedures] for the
 5 warning signs required under this section and requiring[. The
 6 rules must require] that each warning sign:
- 7 (1) include a description of the provisions of Section 8 20A.02(b-1), Penal Code, including the penalties for violating that 9 section;
- 10 (2) be written in English and Spanish; and
- 11 (3) be at least 8-1/2 by 11 inches in size.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
