A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to creating a fine arts allotment under the public school
3	finance system.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 48, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 48.116 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 48.116. FINE ARTS ALLOTMENT. (a) For each student in
8	average daily attendance enrolled in a fine arts education course
9	approved by the agency under Subsection (b) in grades 6 through 12,
10	a school district is entitled to an annual allotment equal to the
11	basic allotment, or, if applicable, the sum of the basic allotment
12	and the allotment under Section 48.101 to which the district is
13	entitled, multiplied by:
14	(1) 1.3 for a student in grades 6 through 8;
15	(2) 1.2 for a student in grade 9 or 10; and
16	(3) 1.1 for a student in grade 11 or 12.
17	(b) The agency shall approve fine arts education courses
18	that qualify for the allotment provided under this section. The
19	approved courses must include fine arts education courses that:
20	(1) are authorized by the State Board of Education,
21	including music, art, theater, and dance;
22	(2) provide students with the knowledge and skills
23	necessary for success in the fine arts; and
24	(3) require a student in full-time attendance to

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1	receive not less than 225 minutes of fine arts instruction per week.
2	(c) Of the funds allocated under this section:
3	(1) at least 25 percent of the funds allocated under
4	Subsection (a)(1) must be used in a manner that prioritizes
5	providing fine arts education to students in grades six through
6	eight who are eligible for the compensatory education allotment
7	under Section 48.104;
8	(2) 50 percent of the total funds allocated under this
9	section must be used to provide fine arts education courses to
10	students in grades six through eight; and
11	(3) except as necessary to meet the requirement under
12	Subdivision (2), at least 75 percent of funds allocated under
13	Subsections (a)(2) and (3) must be used to provide fine arts
14	education courses to students in grades 9 through 12.
15	(d) The agency shall annually publish a list of fine arts
16	courses approved under Subsection (b).
17	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
