- 6 SECTION 1. In this Act, "commission" means the Health and

- 8 SECTION 2. (a) Not later than December 1, 2024, the
- 9 commission shall prepare and submit to the legislature a written
- 10 report regarding state and federally-funded residential and
- 11 nonresidential services provided:
- 12 (1) under the home and community-based services (HCS)
- 13 waiver program;
- 14 (2) under the Texas home living (TxHmL) waiver
- 15 program; and
- 16 (3) by intermediate care facilities licensed under
- 17 Chapter 252, Health and Safety Code.
- 18 (b) The report required under this section must:
- 19 (1) analyze the average monthly cost to the state per
- 20 person disaggregated by level of need for services provided to

- (A) residing in state-operated and privately

- 24 Health and Safety Code, disaggregated by facility size for

- 1 privately operated facilities;
- 2 (B) under the home and community-based services
- 3 (HCS) waiver program; and
- 4 (C) under the Texas home living (TxHmL) waiver
- 5 program;
- 6 (2) compare the severity of need for individuals
- 7 across settings; and
- 8 (3) include, based on data from the previous biennium:
- 9 (A) the total number of individuals,
- 10 disaggregated by level of need, who transitioned from
- 11 state-operated intermediate care facilities licensed under Chapter
- 12 252, Health and Safety Code, to receiving services under the home
- 13 and community-based services (HCS) waiver program; and
- 14 (B) the average monthly cost of services under
- 15 the home and community-based services (HCS) waiver program for
- 16 individuals described by Paragraph (A).
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act expires September 1, 2025.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
